The Greater London Council is also proposing to make an Order the general effect of which will be to impose a maximum speed of 30 miles per hour in that length of Clockhouse Lane, Ashford, between the boundary of the Administrative County of Surrey on the north-west side of Clockhouse Lane and a point 84 feet north-east thereof.
