It is also said they have possess'd themselves of the City of Agde, and taken Hostages for the Payment of one hundred and fifty thousand Livres. The News of this Descent has been sent by several Expresses to Paris. The Court of France not judging the Forces under the Command of the Duke de Noailles, (who is post'd in that Country to awe the Cevennois) sufficient to oppose the Allies, have sent Orders to the Duke of Berwick to detach some Regiments from Provence. The Duke of Noailles is also gone Post to Languedoc from Catalonia, and hath order'd a great part of his Army to follow him.

Falmouth, July 29. Yesterday arriv'd the *S. Francis* of and for London, from Galicia, George Matthews, Master. This Day came in her Majesty's Ships the *Souhampton* and *Lizard*, with three Sail of Coasters from Plymouth, to Convey our Ti. V. Vessels to the Eastward. Came in also the *Dolphin* Galley of and for this Place from London. Thomas Allen Master.

Cowes, July 31. On Friday last came to Spithead from Hamborough, under Convoy of a Man of War, fourteen Merchant Ships; eleven wait for a Convoy to proceed to Portugal, and the other three are gone into Portsmouth.

Whitehall, August 1. This Day the Parliament met at Westminster, and was further prorogued by Commission to the 26th of the ensuing September.
