London Borough of Camden-Doctor Parking Places

Notice is hereby given that, on the application of the Council of the London Borough of Camden, the Greater London Council on 13th June 1977, made:

- (a) the Camden (Parking Places) (No. 1) Order 1977, under sections 35, 36, 37, 40 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by the Transport Act 1968; and
- (b) the Camden (Doctor Parking Places) (No. 1) Order 1977 under sections 35, 36, 37 and 40 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as so amended above.
- 2. The general effect of the Parking Places Order will be to:
- (a) revoke the designation by the Camden (Parking Places) (No. 1) Order 1976 of the metered parking places numbered 153 and 315 therein situated respectively in Little Russell Street and Cromer Street;

(b) designate parking places on the highways specified in Column 1 of Schedule 1 to this notice at which charges may be made by the Borough Council for vehicles authorised by the Order to be left in those parking places

- (c) provide that the type of parking place, the maximum initial period, the rate of charge, the excess period, the excess charges and the hours of operation of that parking place will be as set out in Columns 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 respectively of the said Schedule 1:
- (d) specify that in respect of the parking places, passenger vehicles (12 seats or less), goods carrying vehicles, motor cycles and invalid carriages may be left therein;

(e) provide that the unexpired time shown on a parking meter may be used free of charge and the period during which a
vehicle may not return to a parking place will be one hour;

- (f) provide that certain vehicles may wait free of charge in certain circumstances, e.g to allow persons to board or alight (maximum 2 minutes), to load or unload (maximum 20 minutes) and vehicles left by specified disabled persons (no time limit).
- 3. The general effect of the Doctor Parking Places Order will be to:
- (a) designate parking places on the highways specified in Column 1 of Schedule 2 to this notice;

provide that vehicles displaying a permit issued under the Order may be left in the parking places; provide that the parking places will be in operation between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. on any day of the week; (d) provide that a permit may be issued by the Borough Council on application being made by legally qualified medical

practitioners; (Permits in respect of a parking place on a highway specified in Column 1 of Schedule 2 to this notice will be issued only in connection with the medical practice conducted at the premises specified in relation thereto in Column 2 of the

- said Schedule 2); and
 (e) provide that the charge in connection with the issue of permits will be £45 in respect of each parking place and that the permits will be valid for a period of 12 months.
- 4. The restrictions imposed by the Camden (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 will apply to any areas previously designated as parking places and not re-designated as such as they apply in the immediate vicinity.
- 5. The Parking Places Order and the Doctor Parking Places Order will come into operation for the purposes of the applications for permits, installation of parking meters and for the placing of traffic signs, etc., on 29th June 1977 and for all other purposes on 13th July 1977.
