*The Tiverton (Off-Street Parking Places) (Pay and Display) Order, 1977*

Notice is hereby given that the Tiverton District Council have made an Order under Section 31(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, to control the use of the parking places named in the Schedule to this Notice. The Schedule indicates the class of vehicle, the days and times of operation, the maximum period for waiting and the scale of charges which will apply in respect of each parking place. The Order is known as the Tiverton (Off-Street Parking Places) (Pay and Display) Order, 1977. The purpose of the Order is to introduce provisions relating to the way in which the parking places may be used and to revise the method of charging for such use as well as the cost of parking. Each of the parking places are identified in Column 1 of the Schedule below.

The Order specifies the conditions under which the parking places may be used. Full details are contained in the Order which, together with maps showing the location of the parking places, may be inspected at The Great House, St. Peter Street, Tiverton on any Monday to Friday between 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m.

The Order comes into effect on the 4th July, 1977.
