Lisbon, August 2. N. S.

Othing has lately happened of Confequence on the Frontiers; our Troops in Alenteijo are now affembling. The Enemy keep Poffession of Miranda, but have as yet fent thither no other Troops, besides the Detachment that made the Expedition. They haveno Tropps in Abeyra, and the late Incursion has been

but of small Advantage to them.

Vienna, July 29. N. S. Our last Advices from Hungary say, that the Imperial Army was advancing owards the River Tibris, but it was uncertain whether General Heister would attack the Malecontents, who were affembled at Zolnock, or Invest Agria. Letters from Constantinople fly, that fince the Grand V sier was Deposed, the King of Sweden had renewed his Instances with the Grand Signior for his Affiftance; and it was reported that the Mufti and new Visier were inclined to his Interests, and would furnish him with a numerous Army of Spahi's, Tarters, and Janifaries; that they had represented to the Sal an, that should the Czar of Muscovy think such a Praclice a Rupture of the late Treaty, he could enter into a War with that Prince with much greater Advantage in conjunction with so powerful an Ally as the King of Sweden, than when the Armies of Muscovy had no other Diversion.

Copenhagen, August 5. N.S. Monsieur Pincier, Baron of Koningstein, who was formerly a Privy-Councellor at the Court of the Duke of Holstein-Gotterp, arrived here last Week in Company with the Son of Monsieur Wederkop. Monsieur Alefelt, the Vice-Stadtholder of Hol-flein, who four Years 2go was one of the Privy-Council, and first Commissioner of the Treasury of this Kingdom, but received Orders to repair to this Place. It is said, that he is to be consulted upon the Management of the Affairs of the Treasury, and that he will be restored to his Place in the Council. Monfieur Alefelt, who was lately the Danish Envoy at the Court of Berlin, is appointed to go with the same Character to the Hague. Vice-Admiral Barfus being returned from the East Sea with the Squadron under his Command, in order to convoy Baron Leuendale to Norway, and to continue cruizing in the North Sea for the Security of our Trade, had Instrustions, at the Request of Admiral Guldenlieu, to rejoin the Danish Fleet, and was preparing to fail with his squadron towards the Island of Boraholm; the Admiral having received Intelligence that the Swedish Squadron vas failed from Carefferson: But these Orders of Vice-Admiral Barfus are fince countermanded, and he is now preparing to fail on his first Delign to Norway. The Correspondence between Great Britain and Sweden being frequently intercepted, by reason of the War between the Nonhern Princes, the Bri ish Envoy had Instructions to follicit this Court, that their Letters might have a fafe Pallage through this Country to and from Sweden. The Dutch Envoy joined with the Bri ish Minister in solliciling this Affair, and their request bath been granted, both for Great Britain and Hilland. Berlin, August 5. N. S. The King continues at Landsberg, and the Queen is not yet returned from Grabe. Our Advices from Muscovy say, that the Czar, for the more equal and regular Payment of the Taxes throughout his Dominions, had divided his Empire into eight Districts, and appointed a Receiver General to each. Majely hath expressy enjoined them to Levy the respective Contributions without any unjust Exections, and reserves to himself the Super-Intendency of their Accounts, threatening them with the severest Punishments, if he received the Completion of their Enversions if he receives any just Complaints of their Extortions. They write from Poland, that his Polish Majesty continues at Marienburg, that the Plague is again roke out in fe-veral parts of that Kingdom, and that feven or eight thousand Mu covites are ready on the Coest of Livonia, to be transported to Denmark. Letters from Petersburg of the 15th of July fay, that a new Garrison of Mus-covites, confisting of five riousind Meu, were marched into Riga; that all the Aged, Sick and Weunded, and the Widows of fuch Officers as were killed in the Siege. were fent out of the Town, and that the Czar had fent a Derachment to invest Kexholm.

Brussell, August 13 N. S. A great Train of Artillery will be speedly embarked at Ghen, and sent up the Lys, which we supp se will be employed in the Siege of Aire, as foon as Bethune is furrendred; the greater part of which we hear is already beat down by our Batteries, or burnt to Afhes by our Bombs. Our Letters from Spain of the 28th of the last Month say, that a Detachment from the Confederate Army attempted to take the Fortress of Estadella by Surprise, but that the Garrifon being alarmed, the Defign miscarried, and they were repulsed, with the lots of twenty Men killed or

wounded.

Hague, August 12. N. S. On the 7th Instant the Lord Townshend delivered in a Memorial to the States, and on the 9 h his Excellency had a Conference with the Deputies of the States General. Letters from Genoa of the 26th of the last Month say, they had Advices from Catalonia, that a Party of Miquelets belonging to King Charles had drawn a Body of the Enemy, confifting of one thousand Men, into an Ambuscade, of whom they killed fix hundred, and took feveral Prifoners, add, that a malignant Fever raged in the Dake of An-jou's Army; and that his Catholick Majesiy continued in the Field.
