### DIRECTION PROHIBITING EXERCISE OF POWERS IN RELATION TO CONTROLLED DRUGS

MISUSE OF DRUGS ACT 1971—SECTION 12 (2)

#### COLUMBUS NSOR EFFA

In accordance with section 12 (2) of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State gave the following direction which came into effect on 19th May.

Whereas Columbus Nsor Effa, M.B., Ch.B., a doctor within the meaning of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971, whose registered address is 64 Hinton Road, London S.E.24, was on 14th October 1976 convicted of certain offences under the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 together with certain offences under the Customs and Excise Act 1952 of a kind specified in section 12 (1) (b) of that Act of 1971:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of section 12 of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971, I hereby direct that the said Columbus Nsor Effa be prohibited from having in his possession, prescribing, administering, manufacturing, compounding and supplying and from authorising the administration and supply of any controlled drug within the meaning of that Act.

This Direction does not extend to the doing of anything in circumstances in which it might lawfully be done without being a doctor.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971  
HIGHWAYS ACT 1971

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 211 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 and section 3 of the Highways Act 1971 to authorise the stopping up of the lengths of highway described in Schedule 1 to this Notice in the interests of the safety of the users of the main highway which is a highway to be constructed in accordance with planning permission granted under Part III of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971.

The Order also authorises the stopping up of the private means of access to premises described in Schedule 2 to this Notice and the provision of a new means of access to those premises.

Copies of the Order may be obtained, free of charge, on application to the Secretary of State, Welsh Office, Transport and Highways Group, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff, CF4 5PL (quoting the reference WR15/56/2) and may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Taff-Ely Borough Council, Municipal Buildings, Pontypridd.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the above Act, or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of the 22nd July 1977, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

(All distances are approximate)

The lengths of highway to be stopped up are at Pontypridd in the Borough of Taff-Ely in the County of Mid Glamorgan and are:

1. That length of Morgan Street which extends from its junction with Bridge Street in a general northerly direction for a distance of 27 yards.
