Turin, July 30. N.S.

HE Duke of Savoy being perfectly recovered of his late Sickness, went Yesterday to the Venerie, and is expected back this Evening; next Week le Court will remove to St. George. Letters from the whole Court will remove to St. George. the Army of the 27th fay, that General Thaun having received his Artillery at Maifourneane, began to Cannonade Arches, which was furrendered on the 22d, and the Garrifen of one hundred Men made Prisoners of War. 23d the Army encamped between Arches and Mariones, and the advanced Guard was commanded to possess themfires of that Place; but upon the Approach of our Troops, the Garrison, being one hundred and fifty Men. quitted it with such Precipitation, that they left the greatest part of their Arms behind them. At the fame time Parties were detached to observe the Situation of the Enemy, as well in the Valley of Barcelonette, where they are strong-ly encamped at Tournos, as at Guillestré, and in the Col Our Generals having fully informed themselves of the Posture of the Enemy, commanded General Wachtendonck to advance to the Col de Vars by the Way of Fogliofa, and dislodge the Enemy from that Post. These Orders were executed with Success, the Enemythat were encamped in those Passes retiring as our Troops advanced. General Wachtendonck having passed those Hills, encamped beiween them and Guilleftre, whereby he cuts off the Communication between the eighteen Battalions that are encamped at Tournos, and the reit of the Enemy's Army. General Thaun having by these Motions prevented the Retreat of those Troops, ic is supposed he will Attack them in their strong Camp; and there are Advices that he had already began to Cannonade them. The Consederate Army under the Command of Count Thaun, as yet confifts only of Infantry; but the Imperial Horfe, and those of his Royal Highness, are aftembled at Coni, in order to join the Army when there shall be occ-fron for their Assistance. Two thousand five hundred Horse from Naples are arrived in the Bolognese.

Berne, August 6. N. S. This Day we expected an Account of the further Progress of our Troops in Langue-dx; but our Advices import, that the Men employed in the Descent having raised considerable Contributions in Agde and Fore Cette, and plundered all the Neighbouring Country, reimbarked on the 28th of the last Month with a very valuable Booty; so that although this Expedition was not a concerted Design to penetrate into the Fremy's Country, yet it hath been attended with a sgreat Advantages as they expected. Our steshed Advices from Turin say, they daily expect to hear, that the Marshal de Thum had attacked the Duke of Berwick, who was strongly entrenched in the Passes of the Mountains of Vars; but our Letters from Lions of the 3d Instant say

Libon, August 9. N. S. The Province of TralesMontes is in great Quiet, though the Enemy keep a Detanment in Miranda; but as they are carrying away the
Artillery and Ammunicion, it is probable they do not
intend to continue in that Province. This Court has ordered ten Regiments of Foot, and fix of Horse to march
iato Tralos Montes. The Enemy lie quiet in their Quarters; and the Portuguese General has assumbled his Troops
on the Frontiers.

Hanover, August 12. N. S. The Elector hath appointed Monsieur de Bothmar, Minister of State, to be his Envoy-Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the Court of

Her Majesty the Queen of Great Britain. His Excellency is speedily expected here from the Hague to receive his Instructions, after which he will set out on his Journey for England. The Prince Curakia is gone from hence to Dresden, where he designs to stay seven or eight Days s from which Place he will proceed to England, in order to reside in that Court as the Minister of the Czar of Musecovy.

From the Camp at Viller-Brulin, August 14: N. S. On Tuesday the 12th Instant, the Duke of Mariborough went to the Camp before Bethune, and having visited our Approaches, returned in the Evening to this Camp, and the Prince of Savoy came back at the same time from Lisle. General Fagel has advanced his Saps within a few Paces of the Palisades, and General Schuylemburg has all his Preparations ready for filling up the outer Dirch, which he designed to put in execution last Night, but was prevented by the great Rain that fell two Days together; the Weather being now fair again, his hoped he will meet with no other Obstacle. A great Convoy of one hundred and thirty Boats, laden with Artillery and Ammunition from Holland, is safely arrived at Menin, to be employed in the tuture Operations of the Campaign. Hague, August 15. N. S. The States of Holland are now affembled, and will continue their Session will the end of the next Week; but are only employed in the Resignation of their private Affairs. We hear by the way of Italy, that our Trnops which made the Descent upon Languedoc, reimbarked on the 28th of July, having brought away fifty thousand Crowns which they received as Contributions from the City of Agde and Port Cette, and filled their Barks with all forts of Provisions; and that they retired without any Action with the Enemy. Additions from Barcelona of the 12th of the last Month say, that the King of Spain being joined by the Reinforcements from Italy advanced towards the Effemy, but they declined an Engagement, and were so advantageously encamped, that his Catholick Majesty did not think it p.o-per to attack them. The fame Letters fay, that General Stanhope was very ill of a Fever. Bur we have this Day received Advices from France, that there hathle on a Battel between a Body of our Cavalry, and another or the Encmy's in Catalonia; but are not informed of the Success, nor any other Particulars of the Action, than that General Stanhope was wounded on our fide, and Lieutes nant General Verboom on the Enemy's, either killed or taken Prisoner. We have an Account from Paris, that the French Court have renewed their Alliance with Spain; and that at the fame time the French King was treating with the Allies for the Restitution of the Spanish Monarchy to King Charles the Third, he carried en a Negotiation for the Maintenance and Support of the Duke of Anjou on the Throne of that Kingdom. Duke of Vendosme is also appointed to Command the Army in Catalonia, and we hear he is gone Post to Rouffillon.

Hagus, August 16. N. S. An Express, that was dispatched by her Catholick Majesty, with Letters for the Emperor, communicated the tollowing News of the Victory in Spain to the Government of Milan; from whence a Courier was dispatched with the Account of it to Monficur Sinzarlin, and the other Imperial Ministers residing here.

The Duke of Anjou having Advice, that a Body of five thousand tien of his Catholick Maj-hy's Troops, the greatest part being Palatines, under the Command of Gene al Wesell in the Lampou dan, were on their March to join the Coniederate Army, resolved to decamp the Day before these Troops under General Wesell could be ab e to come up. His Catholick Majesty being informed, that the Enemy were retiring, ordered General Stanhepe to March with fourteen Squadrone of Horse, and some Grenadiers, in order to eisturb the Enemy in their Passage of the Rivers Segra and Noguera, between Lerida and Balaguer. General Stanhope, though but the Day before recovered of a violent Fever, marched with all Diligence, and came up with twenty fix Squadrons of the Enemy's Horse that composed the Rear-Guard of their Army, of which he sent Advice to his Catholick Majesty, and defires he might have Orders to attack them: After having received his O ders he made the Onset with so much Fury, that the Enemy were foon put into Diforder, and obliged to fend all their Horse to sustain the Rear-Guard. At the same time his Catholick Majesty commanded the whole Cavalry of his Army to fustain General Stanhope; upon which all the Horse on both sides came to a general Engagement, and in a very little time his Catholick Ma-jefty obtained a decifive and compleat Victory, with the total Deleat of the Enemy's Cavalry. The General of the Enemy's Horse is taken Prisoner, with several Officers. On our side are killed the Earl of Rochfort, and Count Nassau. General Stanhope received a slight Con usion on his Right Shoulder. It is faid the Duke of Anjou retired to Lerida, and his Catholick Majesty being marched that way, it is expected he will continue to retire, having always been inferior in Foot, and now much weaker in Ho: fe.
