

# The London Gazette.

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Falmouth, May 22.

**T**He 12th instant put to sea from this harbor the *Marigold of London* for *Rochel's*. The next day passed before this place the *Newfoundland Fleet* from *Plymouth*, consisting of ten sail and two Convoys.

The *St Jacob of London* that came from *Virginia* and entered here for *Holland*, is ready to sail with the first fair wind.

Several French vessels are lately put in here laden with Silks, bound for a Market, only one belonging to the Grand party, with the same lading, bound for *Havre de Grace*.

*Lyme, May 23* On Saturday last arrived here the *Thomas* of this place in seven days from *Crossick*, telling us, that the French have by best of Drum called in their seamen to list themselves in the Kings service according to a former Edict; and that they are also forbidden to enter themselves into the service of any foreign Prince or State, and they are fitting up many of their men of war, but tis not known for what service.

*Malta, May 10.* The great Master of the Order having frequent advices given him of the vast preparations made by the Turks both by sea and land, which tis feared may be designed against this Island, has thought fit to put this place into a posture of defence; and has accordingly taken care for the repairing of the Old Works, and raising a Fort Royal at the West end of this Island upon the sea side, to prevent the approaches of any Enemy.

Here are lately come in four men of War belonging to the French Fleet now before *Tunis*, under the Command of Monsieur *Martel*, who has not as yet been able to bring that place to such conditions of Peace as he desires. Here are also arrived four English Merchant ships, and three Hollanders with two Convoys, who are layed again for *Legorne*.

*Copenhagen May 14.* Yesterday his Excellency the Earl of *Essex*, Ambassador from His Majesty of *Great Britain* made his solemn Entry, attended by a Train of 20 Coaches and 6 Horses from the Princesses Court, called the new Attack, and conducted by Monsieur *Erick Rosenbranz*, and Monsieur *Speckan*, Master of the Ceremonies, his Coach attended by many of the King of *Denmark's* Footmen; the Train closed up by many of his Majesties Horse-Guards; at the old Market was drawn up the Regiment of Monsieur *Schak*, the Grand Constable, but it being a time of Mourning, they beat not their Drums, nor gave any Volleys, only at his Excellencies Entry the Great Guns were fired round the Rampart. His Excellency is to be Treated three days upon his Majesties account.

*Rome, May 17.* The Pope finding that by reason of his great age, it is necessary for him to make use of others for the management of publick affairs, has committed a great share of them to Cardinal *Paluzzi*, now *Altieri*, and Cardinal *Patron*, who has already declared his Brother, Prince of a certain Village, whereof he formerly bore the Title of Marquis.

This day was performed the Ceremony of giving Hats to the eight Cardinals, created by the late Pope, viz. *de Bouglion*, *Porto Carrero*, *Cerri*, *Pallavicino*, *Neri*, *Bonaccorsi*, *Bona*, and *Acciacoli*.

To morrow the Portugal Ambassador intends to make a solemn Entry, and in little time to address himself to the Pope as Ambassador of Obedience.

On Monday the Pope intends to hold a Consistory. The Cardinals of the Squadron, who not only in this Conclave, but formerly opposed the exaltation of this Pope, have but little countenance given them at the Court, and many of them are already eased of their employments; nor does the Queen of *Sweden* find that extraordinary favour as in the times of the former Popes.

*Warsaw, May 18.* His Majesty has lately informed the Elector of *Brandenburg*, that he intends about the end of July to receive his Homage for *Lauenbourg* and *Bitau*.

The Crowns Army designs about the end of this month to draw towards *Lemberg*, to whom his Majesty has dispatched some Deputies to assure them in the name of the King and of the Common-wealth, that care will be suddenly taken for the payment of their arrears, to their satisfaction. His Majesty has not omitted any thing that in prudence could be done for the reconciliation of the dissatisfied part of the Nobility, by representing to them the true state of the affairs of that Common-wealth, and the great dangers into which the whole Kingdom must necessarily be involved, should they still persevere in their opposition to his Government, which has had such happy Effects, that the Archbishop of *Gnesse* has began to show his inclinations to submit himself, and the Great Chancellor of the Crown is thinking also of reconciling himself to His Majesty, and many others are following these good Examples.

*Legorn, May 19.* The 14 instant sailed hence Sir *John Harman*, Captain *Parcy*, and a fireship, having under their conduct a Fleet of 33 sail of English Merchant ships bound for *England*; the next day came in the *Expeditio*, the *Providence*, and the *Good fortune* from *Spain* and *Gallipoli*, who upon the news of the departure of the before-mentioned Convoy, went out immediately to sea hoping to overtake them on this side *Marseilles*, several ships being expected to be taken into the Fleet by this way.

The 16th instant arrived here a Bark in 8 days from *Algier*, informing us, that 23 of those Corsairs were returned home, only 9 of them still abroad, which were approved towards the *Levant*.

Yesterday departed two French ships for *Alexandria*, and the *Santa Maria* for *Cyprus* and *Scanderon*. The *John* and *Abigail* may put to sea this night for *Smirna*.

*Vienna, May 23.* The Count de *Ihuin* who was believed to have been much involved in the contrivance of the disturbances in *Hungary*, is said to be lately seized on at *Gratz*. The Count de *Tattenbach* is fallen into an Apony, from which tis not believed he can recover.

The Count *Scerini* and *Franchipani* are civilly Treated in their confinements, Cardinal *Barbarini* has strongly interceded in the behalf of the latter.

The Prince of *Ausperg* has been privately arrested and secured till farther order.

Their Imperial Majesties were expected yesterday at *Luxembourg*, and on Friday intends for *Favorita*, a house of pleasure belonging to the Empress *Eleanor*, where they intend to continue till the 4th of *June*, at which time they intend for this place.

The Courier employed by the Emperor, and lately returned from the *Levant*, informs us, that the Grand Signior has declared, that he had no correspondence with the disturbers of the peace in *Hungary*, nor had any intention to assist them in their rebellion; and to assure the Emperor thereof, he had commanded the *Bassa of Bosnia* and the Governour of the Fort of *Canisla*, to be deprived

of their Charges, and to be sent to his Court to give an account of their private and underhand contrivances and practices with the Count *Serini*, and to proceed severely against them for promising assistance without first acquainting the Court. He likewise tells us, that all the preparations made by the Turks for war were intended against the Persians.

The Imperial forces continue their march for *Hungary*, whither is to be sent also a considerable Train of Artillery with a Convoy of 1800 men, which the Elector of *Saxony* has sent to serve his Imperial Majesty for the reduction of *Hungary* to his obedience.

*Venice*, May 24. Two days since arrived here a Gally from *Spalato* with our Procurator of the City, bringing Letters from General *Barbara*, and an account of the arrival from *Bossna* of the Treasurer to the Bassa of that place for the settlement of the scale of Trade, at his Entry upon the Venetian Territories he was by the Generals Order met by the Extraordinary recurator of *Clissa*, who presented him with excellent Provisions, and attended him to *Spalato*, where he has made some progress into the Treaty, and has already agreed upon the Customs which are to be paid to the *Bassa*. The said Treasurer came well accompanied with 55 persons daily habited, who are entertained in that City with great civility.

Two of our Gallies which have been employed upon the coasts of *Dalmatia*, are sent thence for the Levant, from whence we expect daily to hear the news of the Vessels departure from *Candia* to attend the Grand Signior to *Constantinople*.

This week were mustered here about a thousand soldiers lately returned from *Candia*, and are for their good service to the publick to be still entertained in the Garrisons belonging to this State in *Dalmatia*, and *Terra firma*: care will be also taken to provide for their Officers according to their Merits.

On Monday last returned hither from *Vienna* Signior Abbot *Federicus*, the Emperors Resident, who the next day attended the Colledge.

*Hambourg*, May 29. We cannot yet guess what will be the issue of the dispute between the Elector of *Brandenburg* and the House of *Lunenburg*, both putting in their claims and pretensions to the County of *Regenstein*, formerly possessed by the Count *de Tattenbach* and lately confiscated for his conspiracy against the Emperor. The Elector has sent some of his forces who are now lying near *Regenstein*, but his Engineer, Quartermaster-General, and several other Officers are returned to *Berlin*: tis said, these forces are ordered to take possession of *Regenstein*, and leaving there a Garrison, to return back to their old Quarters. The Elector of *Saxony* and several other Princes are interposing for the composition of this dispute, that so the publick peace may receive no disturbance.

Letters from *Nancy* tell us, that the Duke of *Lorraine* is lately returned thither with many of the Lords of his Court from the Baths of *Plombieres* near *Franche Comte*, where he every year usually divers himself.

The Prince *de Vaudemont* is said to be gone into *Hungary* with the Prince of *Lorraine*, who is there entering upon his Charge of General of the Emperors Cavalry.

The *Lorrainers* are very apprehensive of the intentions and designs of the French, several of their Troops being lately marched into the Bishopricks of *Metz*, *Toul*, and *Verdun*.

From *Stockholme* they write, that the Queen Regent is lately recovered from an Ague, to the great satisfaction of the Court.

It has been thought convenient there to alter their former resolution of raising several Regiments into *Pomerania* and the Part of *Bremen*, and instead thereof, to give Order to their Officers in those places to raise men to reinforce their Companies: only four Regiments are to be sent into *Lithuania* for the strengthening of their Garrisons there, they being not yet fired from their

jealousies of the *Muscovites*, but they are less apprehensive then formerly of a breach with *Muscovy*, since the Chamber of *Tartary* has by his Envoy offered to assist *Sweden* in case of a war.

*Cologne*, May 30. The differences between the Elector and this City were in so fair a way of composition by the care and industry of the Deputies from *Mentz*, that all the Articles of the Treaty were formed and agreed to, and were suddenly to have been signed, but two persons, brethren and inhabitants of this City had nearly ruined all this work by the unseasonable and rash publication of a Libel against the Officers, but these persons are seized on, as is also the Printer, who are like to suffer for their follies, so that tis hoped the Prince and Archbishop of this place will be yet induced to sign the Treaty.

The Prince *de Ligne* arrived the 21 instant at *Auspourg* in good health, with a Train of about 60 persons, where he was presented by the Senate with *Vines* and several sorts of excellent provisor, and feasted by the Magistrates; and went away the next day towards the *Alps* intending for *Genova*, where the Sicilian Gallies are to attend for his transportation.

The Bishop of *Munster* went the 10th instant to *Consveld*, where he intended to make a great entertainment, as a mark of his joy for the election of the new Pope the news whereof he entertained at *Munster* with the firing of all the Guns from the Citadel.

*Hague* June 1. The States of *Holland* having some days since agreed to the admission of his Highness the Prince of *Orange* into the Council of State: yesterday it was also resolved and concluded in a full Assembly of the States General, and an honourable Pension settled on him. It was farther resolved, that whensoever any Army of the States should be drawn into the Field, the Prince should be there present, the better to instruct himself in Military affairs, and fit himself for the Charge of Captain-General by Sea and Land, which might be conferred on him to soon as he should be of age to be elected to it.

The same day the Prince was according to the resolution of the States General introduced into the Council of State by three of the States Deputies, viz The Heer *Van Mourmont*, of *Warlandam* a Representative for *Holland*, the Heer *Stavenisse* for *Zealand*, and the Heer *Cockinga* for *Groetingue*, where his Highness took his seat, one of the twelve Venue Chairs on the side of the Bench. The Deputies returning to give the States an account of his admission.

The same day the Heer *Van Beuning* departed on his way for *England*.

*London*, May 29. The Court still continues with *Madam at Dover* from whence on *Thursday* last in the afternoon, their Majesties, *Madam* and their Royal Highnesses went out to sea in their Yachts, and were attended in the Road by three men of war, and after about two hours divertisement, returned again into Port, and were received with the firing of all the Canon.

On *Friday* last arrived here the Heer *Van Beuning*, employed hither by the States of the *United Provinces*, but continues as yet incognito.
