By Deed Poll bearing date the 13th day of July 1977 SIR (MARK TATTON) RICHARD SYKES otherwise SIR RICHARD (MARK TATTON) SYKES of Sledmere in the county of Humberside Baronet has renounced and abandoned his surname of Sykes and in lieu thereof adopted the surname of Tatton-Sykes and has thereby authorised and required all persons whomsoever at all times to designate describe and address him by his said adopted surname of Tatton-Sykes so that as from the above date of the said Deed Poll which has been enrolled in Her Majesty's College of Arms he is to be known and called Sir Mark Tatton Richard Tatton-Sykes of Sledmere in the county of Humberside Baronet he at all times hereafter in all records deeds documents and other writings in all actions suits and proceedings as well as in all dealings and transactions matters and things whatsoever and upon all occasions intending to use and subscribe the said surname of Tatton-Sykes as his surname in lieu of his said former surname of Sykes.

The Trunk Road (Cowbridge Road West, Cardiff) (Box Junction) Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, which will come into effect on 1st October 1977. The effect of the Order is to establish a

"boxed area" on the area of the carriageway of the London Fishguard Trunk Road (A48) known as Cowbridge Road West, in the City of Cardiff, at the junction of Cowbridge Road West and Amroth Road, marked by the traffic sign specified in diagram 1043 in the Traffic Signs Regulations 1975.

Drivers may not cause their vehicles to enter the "boxed area" unless they can immediately leave it.

A copy of the Order, together with a plan and a statement of reasons for making the Order, may be seen during normal office hours at the offices of the South Glamorgan County Council, County Headquarters, Newport Road, Cardiff, CF2 1XA. Copies of the Order may be obtained, free of charge, on application to the Secretary of State, Welsh Office (Y Swyddfa Gymreig), Transport and Highways Group, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishan, Cardiff, CF5 4PL, quoting the reference WR 174/7/4.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or that any requirement of that Act, or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks of the 19th August 1977 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

*The Trunk Road (Tremont Road, Llandrindod Wells)
(Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1977*

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales proposes to make an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 6 of the Road Traffic Act 1974. The effect of the Order will be to prohibit waiting at any time on the sides of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle; to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle; to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building, industrial or demolition operation, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, or the maintenance of the road or the services therein; or to enable the vehicle to be used in the service of a local or water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

Exceptions will also be provided in the Order to allow vehicles bearing both a disabled persons' badge and a parking disc to wait in the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this notice for a period not exceeding two hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less
