Although this Action can properly be called an Engagement only of the Horfe, yet it was so furious, that not only their whole Cavalry was overthrown and routed with the utmest Consusion, but all the Infantry siel with the same Precipira ion: The Foot retired intermingled with their Horse, observing no Order of Retreat, but many throwing down their Arms in their Flight; the Army is felt leaving behind them their Cannon and leads of Ammunition, as well as abandoning their Baggage and Equipage to the Pealants: The Advantage obtained feems to be of the fame Confequence as an entire Victory, which was prevented only by the Darkness of the Night. On our fide about four hundred Men were killed and wounded; of whom the Regiment of Jeerger loft ficteen; the English Regiments of Harvey, Rochfort, Pepper and Neffen ab ut two hundred; the Dutch Regiments of Martha and Schlippenbach each afteen; the Regiment of Ormitorn thirty tine; that of Spee, and two other Regiments of Palatines, one hundred. The Lord Rochfort and the Count de Nassau are among the Slain, who being Officers of great Meric and Dittinction, their Lofs is univerfally lamented in he Army. On the Enemy's fide the Dake de Sarno, a Licurenant General, was found among the flain; what other confiderable Officers were killed we have no vet an 'count, but there must be a great Number, in regard that the Rout was general. We have taken Prifozers Lieutenant General Verboom, Don Vico Parifio Colonci of the Life Guards, one Lieutenant-Colonel, four Captains, fir cen Littl enants and Cornets, and three hundred private Men. The Number of the Prifoners had been greater, if our Men in the heat of the Action could have charged themselves with hem. His Catholick Majesty by his Prafence animated the Troops during the Heat of the Action, and all the Generals in their respective Posts obeyed his Orders with great Address and Gallantry.
