
The Plan referred to in the foregoing Order in Council



At the Court at Windsor Castle, the 29th day of July 1977 PRESENT.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Secretary of State for the Environment that burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in the old Churchyard of St. Lawrence, Ayot St. Lawrence, in the County of Hertfordshire, has, in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 11th day of May 1977, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853 (1853 c. 134), and of all other powers Her enabling, is

pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith in the old Churchyard of St. Lawrence, Ayot St. Lawrence, in the County of Hertfordshire, shown hatched on the plan annexed

Provided that, in any vault or walled grave now existing in the said Chuchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stone-work or brickwork properly cemented.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Old Churchyard of St. Lawrence, Ayot St. Lawrence, Hertford-shire) Order 1977.
