N the 2d Instant their Royal Highnesses removed to St. George for the Benefit of the Air. wices from the Camp of Fogliofa of y starday that on the 31st of the lest Month three hundred Gienzdiers attacked the Fortress of Castellet, which lies Beir Serena, under the Mountains of Maurin, and after a hor Reliftance obliged the Garrison to furrender themfive Priloners of War. Count Thaun hath cur off the Communication between Tournos and Vars, and the Marquis d'Andorno hath passed the Mountains of Agnello, and advanced as far as Seillac into Dauphire; but the Enemy h ve so strongly fortified themselves in he Camp at Tourn's, har it is thought impregnable, and the Fortes of Vars will prevent our March to the Camp at Guillestre. General Rhebinder hash passed Mont General with his Forces, in order to act in concert with Count T: un; and last Night a Council of War was to be held at Fogliosa, where the Marquis d' Andorno and Geperal Rhebinder were expected, to conful about the tur-

ther Operations of the Campaign.

Venice, August 9. N. S. Last Saturday the senate ratisted the Treaty of Accommodation between the Pope and this Republick, and ordered the Dataria to be opered The Abbo Gasparini hath also delivered in his Creden mas and been received as Internuncio from the Court of Rome. The Migistrales have fent Commissaies, to the Frontiers, to examine all Persons that come from Hungary or Poland, whether they have passed through any Places inscreed with the Plague, and unless they are fully fatisfied that they are tree from the Contagion, they are commanded not to permit any Trevellers to enter our Territories. The like Precautions are taken in regard to all Packets and Letters that are fent hither from those Kingdoms. A Sloop called the Dolphin is arrived here with Sugar from Lisbon; the came in Company with the Brice Galley, which was raken on the Coaft of Malta by the Phoenix Privaccer, commanded by Caprain l'Aigle, who hath teen a long time cruifing near that Island: She hath firty fix large Guns and forty two Oare, with five hundred Men, and by reason of her Strength and Swittness, doth a great prejudice to the Levant Trade. The Knights of Malta give all possible Assistance to the French, as being supplied with Provisions, and all other Necessaries from Sicily. Letters from Rome of the 2d Inflant say, that the Pope hath given Orders that Prayers be offered up in all the Churches and Convents, and in their Ordinary Devotions, during three Days, to invoke a Beffing on a great Defign his Holinefs hath refolved to execute, which is as yet a Secret. These Letters add, that the Pope hath received a Letter from the Cardinal Bouilless, wherein he notifies his Departure the Cardinal Bouillon, wherein he notifies his Departure from France, the Reasons for his late Conduct, and his Resolution to employ the remainder of his Life in a Religi-

ous Exercise of his Dury. The Cardinal is highly esteemed at Rome, and will be very well received at the Court. Letters from Naples say, that two Men of War, one English, and the other Dutch, had brought into that Port a French Prize valued at two lve thouland Crowns, and waited to Convoy fame Troops and Harfes that were spedily to be transported to Caralonia. Cardinal Grimani hath commanded four Companies of Imperialists to be embarked at Reggio, who are to reinforce the Garrisons of Orbitello and Piombico in Tuscany. We have received Advice of the March of the Regiments of Daun and Vaubonne through the Bologneze.
