

Guns and two Patereroes, laden with Soap, Coffee, Galls and other Merchandizes; which Lading she is said to have received from Marfeilles. The Southsea Castle sailed again this Morning to cruize.

Deale, August 20. On the 17th Instant Commodore Cornwall, in her Majesty's Ship the Dreadnought, arrived here with the Lancaster, Norfolk, Plymouth, Salisbury, Salisbury's Prize, Winchester, Anelope and Dover. The same Day the Outward-bound and Coasters sailed to the Westward, under Convoy of her Majesty's Ship the Plymouth. On the 18th the Plymouth, with the Delicia-Hospital, and the Fleet under their Convoy, were put back by contrary Winds. Yesterday Morning came down her Majesty's Ship the Weymouth; also the Raby Frigate, bound for Falmouth. The Salisbury and Cruiser sailed this Morning to cruize off of Dunkirk; and the Weymouth to the Westward. The Outward-bound and Coasters, with their Convoy, are preparing to sail again to the Westward.
