VHIS Day we received Letters from Genoa of the 14th Infrant, which fay, the Account of the Victory obtained by the Allies in Spain is confirmed by Letters from Barcelona of the 6th, which bring us the following account of the Action, and the Confequences of it: The Battel happened on the 27th of the lift Month near the Fals of Alfariaz on the Noguera; whither our Army marched to prevent the Enemy from taking the Comp of Almanar near that Patis, and the difpating that Camp was the occation of the Battel. The Attack wasmade by a Detachment of our Army commanded by General Standope: However, the whole Army had marched up to furport that Detachment; and that Gearral attacked the Enemy fo vigorously, that he foon put them to flight, and purfued them with Slaughter 'till the Night favoured their Elcape. The Enemy's Army was quite broke, having abandoned in their flight feveral Pieces or Cannon, their Ammunition and Equipages. These Letters by the Enemy have left five thousand Men in this Adion; including fuch as are mortally wounded. On our fide the Loss does not amount to above four hundred Men, and it is confirmed that Count Nassau and the Lord Rochfort are of that number. On the 1st Instant our Army marched to penetrate in o Arragon; on the 2d they took Polkshon of the Bridge of Mangan, where they made one kundred and fifty Men that guarded it Prisoners of War, and defigned to March further into the Country, in order to oblige the Enemy to abandon Lerida, which 'tis thought they will rather do, than fuffer their Communication with their Magazines at Fraga to be cut off. On the 4th Count Attelaya was fent with a De achinent to invest Balbastro; on the 5th in the Evening they received Advice at Barcelona from the Camp at Mongon, that the Place had furrendred, and the Garrison, confisting of three bundred Men, made Prisoners of War- Letters from Tu-im of the 13th say, that it appeared to Count Dawn impracticable to penetrare into Dauphine, and the elore it was believed that the Project was changed; and that the Confederate Army would attempt formething on another fide to keep the Everny in motion, and hinder them from making any Detachment to Figures s.

Bruffels, Azgust 27. N. S. Advices from Madrid of the 12th fay, the two Armies in Catalonia remain in the fame Simation; that of his Catholick Majesty was encamped with the Right at Tamarie; and extended the Lett to the Noguria; that of the Duke of Anjon continued near Lerida in glearwant of Foreget and learing to decamp because of the Nethbourhood of the Confederate Army, which likewife prevents the Enemy from being joined by a Detach-ment they have recalled from Arragon. Count Staremberg sain taken the Bridge of Mor.com, which the Enemy had fortified, and made the Garrison, confifting of two bundred Men, Prisoners of War. tion, wi hour making any Attempt.

Bruffels, August 30: N. S. An Express is just now arrived from the Camp before Bethuse, with the agreeable News, that the Governor beat the Chamade at General Schuylemburg's Attack on the 28th, between five and fix in the Evening. Two Equations of Draguons arrived here this Day from the Army: They are to be en ployed against the Enemy's Par ics, which very much infest this To Morrow Te Deum is to be Sung, Neighbourhhood. and other Rejoycings will be made at this flace, and in the other great Towns of these Provinces, for the Victory obtained by his Catholick Maj. fly in Catalonia on the 27th of the left Month. Letters from Paris of the 23d fay, the Duke of Vendome fet out the Day before, in order to take upon him the Command of the Army in Catalonia. By Advices from thence of the 9th Inflant a Detachment of the Army of his Catholick Majesty had taken the Town of Morcoa on the Cinca, making the Garrison Prisoners of War, and were preparing tondumee further into Arragon. The Army of the Duke of Anjou remained under the Cannon of Lerida, in great want of Forage.

Lift. August 30. N. S. Last Week a very unfortunate Accident happened at la Baffé:; five Waggons laden with Powder took Fire in the Market Place at three of the Clock in the Afternoon, burn two hundred Perfons and thirty Horses, and overthrew all the Neighbouring A great many Booths and Shops of Tradefmen were confumed to Ashes with their Goods, and the Place is a dismal spectacle of Ruin. We have just now an Account of the Surrender of Bethuse, but have not yet the

Particulars of the Capitulation.

Hague, August 29. N. S. Last Week a Squadron of Men of War failed from Amsterdam to the Northward, for the Security of our Commerce in the Baltick, which they are resolved to preserve against all Attempts either Danes or Swedes, on any Pretence whatfoever. On the 27th Instant Publick Rejoicings were made here tor the Victory obtained by his Catholick Majesty in Catalonia on the 27th of the last Month. The Baron de Bothmar, Envoy-Extraordinary from the Elector of Hanover, is fet out for that Court, in order to receive his new Credentials for the Court of Great Britain, where he is to refide in the room of the late Baron Schultz. Monfigur de Sormes, who is appointed to be the Refident of King Augustus in Great Britain, is preparing to set out for that Kingdom. All the late Advices from Conflantinople agree, that the Turks are enclined to break the Truce with the Muscovites, that the Grand Vizier had commanded the usual Signal of a War to be hung out, and that they were laying up Milrary Stores, and making the necessary Preparations. The Poles and Muscovics feem apprehensive of their Designs, are matching their Porces towards the Frontiers, and Brengthning those Places

that are the Barriers to their Country.

Leghorne, August 11. N. S. The cheering, commanded by Captain Heager, is arrived here, and brought Advice that the Medway had taken a French Privateer of thirty eight Guns and two hundred and eighty Men near Caps

de Gzeja, and carried her into Gibrattar.

Hague, September 2. N. S. By the late Post we had Advices from Inspruck of the Passage of a Courier through that Town in his way to Vienna, with the News of a fecond Victory obtained by his Catholick Majofty in Spain. We have received a Confi mation or this News from Several Parts; and this Day we had certain Accounts of it from Paris. Montieur Cronfton, the Envey of Swe den in that Court, bath written to Monfieur Palmquift refiding here, that they had received an Express from Bayonne, with the News of the entire Defear of the Duke of Anjou's Army near Saragoffa. The Envoy of Genoa hash received his time Advices from the Minister of that Republick as Paris, and divers Accounts of the V. Ctory have been fent hither from other Hands. The Battl was fought on he 20th of August near Saragosta. It is fild the Battalions that were recalled from Flanders retufed to fight, and the w down their Arms. Their Cavalry made little Residences, but the Duke of Anjou's Guards are fud to the behaved themfelves with great Gallantry; the Duke him felf escaped to Madrid with a very few Followers. Last Night the Yarmouth arrived at St. Hellens from the Westward, and failed again about five of the Clock this Morning with the Jerkey and Medway's Frize for the West Indies, Captain Lit leten is on Board the Jerfry as Com-modore. Yest rday allo the Delight, Seahorse and Difpatch Brigamme failed to the Westward through the Needles. The same Day the Royal Ann failed into the Harbour.
