IS Imperial MajeRy has lately held feveral Councils, upon the prefent l'ofture of his offairs. It is supposed that the Count de Marchitz will be Bihamia, in the room of Count Tzernin, Governor of who died la c'y at Prague. On Wednesslay last an Express brought In elligence, that the Duke of Anjou's Cavalry was wholly our off by the King of Spain; and y flerday Count Startenberg, a Liquienthit Colonel in the Spanish Service, brought a full Relation of the Particulars of that victory, which caused an extreme Sa issaction in this Court. Advices from Hungary say, that Prince Ragotzi hiving left three bundred Men at Zolneck, had advanced within four Leagues of the Gamp of General Heister, with a Body of fixteen thousand Men, with a defign to throw fire hundred Waggons lades with Provisions into Neuhusel; but upon Advice that the Imperialists were in motion in order to arrack him, he retired towards Caffo-via with great Precipitation. These Advices add, that General Pain continued the Biockade of Neuhausel; and that the Garrison tearing the want of Provisions, had fent out all the Prisoners whom they had taken from the Im-

Monsieur Lilhaven, the King's Resident at Warhim went from hence last Monday, in order to return to King Augustus's Court; and we hear Monsieur Marshall, who has lately been with the Czar, is daily expected here. The Mareschal de Eczons has fortified all the Passes towards his Camp, as well to prevent being furprizeds as to pur a stop to the Desertion from his Camp for the future. These Advices add, that our Parties had obtained very many Advantages over those of the French's and that the Detachment of fix thousand Men which was on the March towards Flanders, and was ordered to halt, had received fresh instructions to move on.

Bruffels, September 1. N.S. Letters from Paris fay, that their latest Advices from Spain import, that the Allies were possessed of Mongon and Balbastro, and had detached several Bodies of Proops into different Parts of Arragon to engage the People to declare for his Catholick Majesty, by giving them Assurances of being re-esta-blished in the ancient Rights and Privileges which had been taken from them by the Duke of Anjou. The taking of thefe Places was the Confequence of the Victory obtained at Almenara. Fresher Advices from the fame Place import, that the Armies of his Catholick Majesty and the Duke of Anjou had again engaged near the Walls of Saragoffa, on the 20th of the last Month, and that the Allies gained an entire Victory. The left Letters from Germany had given us an Account of a fecond Engagement in Spain; but it appears that those redvices were founded only on further Particulars of the first Advantage ob sined by the King of Spain, the second Bastel having been fought too lately to be known at those Places from whence those Advices, according to their Dates, were dispatched.
