Subject to the limitations provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (2) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the Smoke Control Area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £100 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite coke and other carauthorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other car-

bonised fuels, gas and electricity. Copies of the Order and of the map referred therein may be inspected free of charge at the Manor House, Turners Hill, Cheshunt, at all reasonable times during the period of 6 weeks from 25th November 1977.

Within the said period, any person who will be affected by the Order may, by notice in writing to the Secretary, Department of the Environment, 2 Marsham Street, London

SWIP, object to the confirmation of the Order. If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before 1st November 1978, or before a later date to be determined by the Department of the Environment.
