The Trunk Road (Billesdon) (Prohibition of Waiting) (Variation) Order 197

The Secretary of State for Transport has made the above-mentioned Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, on part of the Birmingham—Great Yarmouth Trunk Road (A47) at Billesdon in the County of Leicestershire.

The effect of the Order, which comes into operation on 28th November 1977, is to vary the Trunk Road (Billesdon) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1973 by providing an exemption to enable a disabled person's vehicle which displays a disabled person's badge and a parking disc to wait for a period not exceeding 2 hours in lengths of Leicester

Road where waiting is prohibited.

Any person who desires to question the validity of, or of any provision contained in, the Order on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of that section or of any regulations made under that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of 16th November 1977 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein

The Trunk Road (Dymchurch) (Bus Stops (Clearway) and Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 197

The Secretary of State for Transport proposes to make an Order under sections 1 and 84(D) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 on the Folkestone—Brighton—Southampton—Dorchester—Honiton Trunk Road (A259) at Dymchurch, in the District of Shepway in the County of Kent.

The effect of the Order would be:

(i) to restrict waiting to 20 minutes in any 1 hour on

the side of road specified in Schedule 1 to this notice; (ii) to prohibit waiting at all times on the sides of road specified in Schedule 2 to this notice; and (iii) to prohibit vehicles other than buses from waiting between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on any day at any bus stop on that side of road specified in Schedule 3 to this notice, where the carriageway at that stop is marked (a) as a bus stop, and (b) with a broad yellow line adjacent to the edge of the carriageway or in the case of a lay-by, adjacent to the kerb line.

The Order, if made, would while it remained in force, enable the Department at any time to lay or to remove the authorised markings at or from any bus stop on the specified side of trunk road or to adjust the position on that road of the authorised markings, as traffic conditions may require.

Exceptions would be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein. There would also be a provision exempting disabled persons' vehicles which display in the relevant prescribed position a disabled persons' (orange coloured) badge.

A copy of the Order, a copy of the Order to be revoked, together with a plan illustrating the proposals and a statement explaining the Secretary of State's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be inspected during office hours at the offices of the Shepway District Council at the Civic Centre, Folkestone.

The effect of the Order, which comes into operation on 28th November 1977 is to vary the Trunk Road (Various Roads, Higham Ferrers) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1974 by providing an exemption to enable a disabled person's vehicle which displays a disabled person's badge and a parking disc to wait for a period not exceeding 2 hours in lengths of High Street, College Street, North End, and Market Square where waiting is prohibited.

Any person who desires to question the validity of, or of any provision contained in, the Order on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of that section or of any regulations made under that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of 16th November 1977 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
