

*Deale, September 5.* This Day came in her Majesty's Ships the Kingston, Pembroke and Porpoise, with twelve Sail from Jamaica under their Convoys. Here in her Majesty's Ships the Royal-Sovereign, Royal Ann, Yarmouth, Augusta, Wolsich, Pool, Solings and Shoreham's Prize, with several outward bound Merchant-men, Coasters and Colliers.

*Whitehall, September 6.* Her Majesty has appointed the Duke of Beaufort Lord-Lieutenant of Hampshire, and Warden of New Forest; the Lord Rochester, Lord-Lieutenant of Cornwall, during the Minority of the Earl of Bath; and Mr. Webb Governor of the Isle of Wight.

Whereas the following Agreement hath been made with the Court of France, for the Security of the Fishing Boats of both Nations, viz.

"That from and after the 15th Day of this present Month of September, all Fisher Boats, of both Sides, that shall catch Herrings, Mackarel, O fers, Lobsters, and all sorts of flat and fresh Fish, as also such Vessels as shall pass to and fro to buy and carry the Fish to Market, shall not be molest'd, from the Orcaides, round the Coast of Great Britain and Ireland, the Islands of Guernsey and Jersey included, and from the Strait of Ostend to Bayonne; but that if any Fisher Boat be found with Salt or Barrell, or any salted Fish of both Sides, and taken, they shall be made lawful Prizes.

The Right Honourable the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, &c. do hereby strictly Charge and Require all Captains and Commanders of Her Majesty's Ships and Vessels, as also all Persons who now have, or shall have private Commissions or Letters of Marque, not to molest any of the Fishing Vessels belonging to the Subjects of France, within the Limitations before mentioned, as they will answer the contrary at their Peril.
