Bolsover District Council Public Footpath No. 7, Pinxton, Public Path Diversion Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that on the 10th January 1978, the Bolsover District Council confirmed the above-named Order. The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert that length of public right of way commencing approximately 80 metres from its junction with Suff Lane, Pinxton, running in a southerly direction for approximately 13 metres, to a new line commencing approximately 80 metres from the junction with Suff Lane, Pinxton, in a south-easterly direction for 7 metres, south-westerly for 4 metres, then due south for 22 metres, then turning west for 12 metres to join the line of the original footpath approximately 93 metres from the junction with Suff Lane, Pinxton.

The District of Daventry (Footpath DD4) (Parish of Moulton) Public Path Diversion Order 1978
