NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

The Babergh District Council (Parish of Nayland-With-Wissington Footpath No. 17) Public Path Diversion Order 1977.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on the 29th December 1977 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed by the Babergh District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert that part of Footpath No. 17 running from a point on the western bank of the River Stour approximately 700 metres north-east of Smallbridge Hall Farm in a north-easterly direction across Field OS No. 4359 for approximately 110 metres to a point on the extreme north-eastern corner of the said Field approximately 190 metres south of the Bures/Nayland-with-Wissington Road; to a line running from a point on the western bank of the River Stour approximately 700 metres north-east of Smallbridge Hall Farm in an easterly direction along the western boundary of the river bank for approximately 60 metres and proceeding in a north-easterly direction along the river bank for approximately 100 metres, then in a north-westerly direction along the north-eastern boundary of Field OS 4359 for approximately 80 metres to a point where the footpath rejoins the original route.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the offices of the District Secretary, Babergh District Council, Toppesfield Hall, Hadleigh, Ipswich, IP7 5DW between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the District Secretary, Babergh District Council, Toppesfield Hall, Hadleigh, Ipswich, IP7 5DW before the 16th February 1978 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

In no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Babergh District Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State, any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.

London Borough of Greenwich (Norman Road) Public Path Extinguishment Order 1977

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 30th December 1977, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for Transport for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Council of the London Borough of Greenwich.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to extinguish the public right of way situate on the east side of Norman Road, London S.E.10, running from a point 21 metres south of the parapet of the railway bridge eastwards from Norman Road, London S.E.10, to a point opposite the eastern flank wall of number 159 Greenwich High Road, London S.E.10.

The County of Hereford and Worcester (Footpath No. 21, Himbleton and Footpath No. 6 (Part, Huddington) Public Path Extinguishment Order 1976.

Notice is hereby given that on 29th December 1977, the Secretary of State for the Environment confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed is to extinguish the public rights of way in the Parishes of Himbleton and Huddington commencing at a point west of Little Brook and proceeding in an easterly direction over the brook and thence in a north-easterly direction for approximately 220 yards, and thence in a south-easterly direction for approximately 317 yards to terminate in the Crowle to Himbleton road at a point opposite Owl's Lane.

A copy of the Order and a map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Wychavon District Council Offices, 37 High Street, Pershore between 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

The Order becomes operative as from 26th January 1978, but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 12th January 1978 make an application for the purpose to the High Court.

NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

Leicestershire County Council (Footpath No. O.40 (Part) Ravenstone with Snibstone) Public Path Diversion Order 1977.

Notice is hereby given that the Leicestershire County Council has confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert that part of public footpath No. O.40 leading from Heather Lane, Ravenstone to bridleway O.41 north of Heather, which extends from its junction with Heather Lane, Ravenstone and in the north-east corner of O.P. No. 0087 in a generally south-westerly direction through that parcel to a point on the boundary of O.P. Nos. 0087 and 0081, to a line which extends from a junction with Heather Lane, Ravenstone on the northern boundary of O.P. No. 0087 (approximately 60 metres west-south-west of the existing entrance to footpath O.40) in a southerly direction through the parcel to rejoin the existing footpath at the point on the boundary of O.P. Nos. 0087 and 0081 previously described.
