Copenbagen, Sept. 9. N. S. On the 7th Infant publick Thanks were given in all the Churches of this City for the taking of Riga; the Cannon on the Ramparts were thrice nied, as likewife all the Cannon of the Fleet. Vice-Admiral Barfoed, with the Transports, has joined the Fleet, which is still at Anchor on the Coast of this Island, but is under Orders for Sailing. There is a Report here, that the Swedish Fleet from Carlscroon is at Sea, and is bined by the Squadron that was in the Gulf of Finland. The King has given the Title of Privy-Councellor to Baron Pincier of Koningsein, Brother-in-Law to Monsieur Wederkop, who came here some Weeks ago to desire the King's Protection against the Court of Gottorp. He has given the Title of Gentleman of the Chamber to the Son of Monsieur Wederkop, and has taken an Estate of his under his Protection. Copenhagen, September 16. N. S. The King has Published an Order to offer to Sale by way of Auctionto the highest Bidder, all the Rights and Presentations he has to Churches within the Kingdom of Denmark, and to fell likewise the Revenues belonglagtothose Churches, which, as Patron, were veit-d in him, the Incumbents being accustomed to retive only a very small Sallary from the Patron; and the rest of their Maintenance coming from the Contributions of their Parishioners: The Patron who has those Revenues is likewise obliged to the Reparations and other necessary Expences belonging to the Churches. Besides this, the King at the time offers to sell the Tenths, which certain

Lands, over and above the Taxes and Contribu-tions common to all. The Danish Fleet under the Command of Admiral Guldenleuw fet fail on the 14th Instant, to the East Sea, and carried with it the Transports which are to bring the Mulcovites hither. An Order having been some time ago published here, to forbid all Commerce with the City of Dantzick, upon pretence of its being Infected with the Plague, the Magistrates of that City have represented to the King, that the Report was groundless, and that their City is free from all infection; upon which an Order is now publified to revoke the former, and allow the Liberty of Commerce with that City, but it is in the fame Instructions forbidden with the Towns of Frushia and Fomerania, which are Infested. The Danish Officers that were exchanged for the Swedish Lieutenant-General, are arrived here. Capt. Scor, the Commander of the Runney, on Board of which the Exchange was made, gave the Swedish Prisoners a magnificent Entertainment on that Occasion.

Hanover, September 10. N.S. Last Night the Earl Rivers arrived here, and this Day his Lordthip had his first Audience of the Elector, and dined afterwards with the Electoral Family: The Court is at Herren-House, a Mile distant from hence.

Brussels, September 17. N. S. Private Letters of the 2d Inlant from St. Sebassian bring Advice, that some Days after the Victory obtained on the 20th, upon Count Staremberg's having made a strong Detachment towards Castille, the Enemy had abandoned Tudela, whereupon the Inhabitants of that Place had fent Deputies to make their Submission to his Catholick Majesty at Saragosia. Detachment is likewife made to reduce the Kingdom of Valencia. It is believed this Undertaking will meet with no Difficulties, the Inhabitants having always given great Tellimonies of their Zeal for the House of Austria. The main Body of his Catholick Majesty's Army is said to be advanced further into Navarre, which Kingdom is un-provided of Necessaries and Troops for a De-fence. These Letters add, that the Duke of Vendome was arrived at Bayonne, where he had held a Council of War with the Duke of Noailles and the Governor of Guienne. The Reports of the Duke of Anjou's retiring to Burgos, with his Dutchess and the Prince their Son, is not confirmed; but an Account is daily expected of their having left Madrid, and several Advices from Paris mention that Circumstance.

From the Campat St. André, September 22. N.S. On Friday the 19th feveral Batteries of Cannon and Market St. and Mortars began to fire from our two Attacks before Aire, and have fince continued to play with fuch Success, that the Enemy do now give our Men scarce any other Disturbance in their Approaches than from their Small Arms, which have hitherto caused us but a very incon derable Loss. At our Attack near the Village of St. Quentin we have made Lodgments on the Ditches of the two Redoubts, and are making the Disposition for attacking them. Yesterday Morning the Inundation began to run off at this Attack so plentifully, that the Engineers promise us a very good E eet from it. At the Attack near the Village of Lambré, we have advanced Communications on the Left close to the first Ditch, and on the Right within fity Paces of the Counterfarp. A Dyke which kept up the Waters, being, by the Mistake of one of the Engineers, cut in the wrong Place on Saturday Night, did some Damage to our Trenches on the Right, but the same is since repaired. At St. Venant our Batteries began to fire yesterday Morning upon the two Bailions which face our Approaches, and there is a Lodgment made along the first Ditch, which they are preparing to fill up. On Friday last a Convoy of Ammunition and Provisions coming up the Lys from Ghent, with a Convoy of twelve hundred Foot and four hundred and lifty Horse, was attacked near St. Eloy-Vive, by a Detachment of about four thousand Men of the Enemy's Troops, who having beat our Convoy, blew up the Powder, and funk the Boats, in order to stop up the Passage of the River; but mon or those laden with Corn and other Provisions, being at fome distance from the others, were preserved. This Accident was chieny occasioned by the Boats fetting out from the Sas de Gand two Days later than was concerted with the Commanders of the Convoy; but that Convoy having chiefly condited of Provisions of Corn and other Necessaries, and not of Military Stores, that Loss can be so easily repaired. repaired, that it will not obstruct the Siege. sterday was observed in the Army as a Day of Thanksgiving for the second Victory in Spain, and in the Evening we made a Tripple Discharge or our Artillery and Small Arms. The French Army is encamped with the Right near St. Pol, and the Leits at Hedin, the Head Quarters being at Valentin, near the last of these Places. 'I is said the Marshal de Villars is to leave the Army to Morrow or Wednesday, in order to go to the Waters of Bourbon; the Marshal d'Harcourt being daily expected to relieve him.
