## NOTICE OF APPLICATION TO VARY A LICENCE TO ABSTRACT WATER

### PORTSMOUTH CITY COUNCIL

THE CONTROL OF POLLUTION ACT 1974

The Portsmouth No. 1 Noise Abatement Order 1978

Notice is hereby given that on the 10th February 1978 the Portsmouth City Council, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 63 of the above-mentioned Act, made an Order entitled "The Portsmouth No. 1 Noise Abatement Order 1978" declaring the area set out in the Schedule to this notice to be a Noise Abatement Zone, which said Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Fruienment for confirmation of State for the Environment for confirmation.

The Order, if confirmed, will allow Portsmouth City Council to control noise levels emanating from the following classes of premises:

- 1. Industrial.
- 2. Commercial.
- 3. Places of entertainment or assembly.

If confirmed, the Order shall not come into operation before 1st January 1979 or before a later date determined by the Secretary of State for the Environment.
