##### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 211 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 to authorise the stopping up of the length of highway specified in the Schedule to this notice in the interests of the safety of the users of the main highway which is a highway to be constructed in accordance with planning permission granted under Part III of that Act.

The Order requires the provision of a new highway.

Copies of the Order may be obtained, free of charge, on application to the Secretary of State, Welsh Office (Y Swyddfa Gymreig), Transport and Highways Group, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff, CF4 5PL (quoting the reference WR15/71/15), and may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Cardiff City Council, City Hall, Cardiff.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of the 16th February 1978 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

#### SCHEDULE

(All Distances are approximate)

The length of highway to be stopped up is at St. Mellons in the County of South Glamorgan and is that length of Vaindre Lane which extends from a point 660

yards east of its junction with Newport Road (A.4161) in a general easterly direction to a point 777 yards east of the said junction, a distance of 117 yards.

#### SCHEDULE

The length of highway to be stopped up is at Cardiff in the County of South Glamorgan. It is shown by zebra hatching on the deposited plan and is an irregularly shaped length of Barrack Lane which has a maximum length of approximately 22 yards, more particularly delineated on the deposited plan.

##### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales proposes to make an Order under section 212 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 for extinguishing any rights which persons may have to use vehicles on that length of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

The proposed Order will contain provisions for permitting the use of that highway by vehicles being used:

- (a) for police, ambulance or fire brigade purposes;
- (b) on behalf of a statutory undertaker of the Post Office and engaged upon the laying, erection, inspection
