GOSPORT BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Gosport (Gale Moor Avenue) (Prohibition of Waiting) (No. 2) Order, 1978

Notice is hereby given that the Gosport Borough Council as agents for the Hampshire County Council has made an Order under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of this Order which comes into operation on the 20th March 1978 will be to prohibit waiting at any time on both sides of Gale Moor Avenue from the junction of Nos. 14-16 to the junction of Nos. 32-34 and from the junction of Nos. 67-69 to the junction of Nos. 69-71.

The Order will contain provisions for the usual exemptions to permit waiting by registered medical practitioners, midwives and district nurses in the course of their professional duties; for boarding or alighting; for the loading and unloading of goods; for funerals; for building operations and work in connection with public services; disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended, or on the grounds that any of the requirements of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from the 14th March 1978, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

LUTON BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Luton (Sundon Park Road/Hill Rise) (Traffic Regulation) Order 1978

Notice is hereby given that on the 6th March 1978, the Luton Borough Council, as agents of the Bedfordshire County Council, made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which will be to provide for the following traffic regulation measures, in addition to those in operation in the vicinity:

1. Waiting will be restricted to two hours at any one time between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Monday to

Saturday inclusive, in the service road fronting Nos. 25-31 The Parade, Sundon Park Road, in the lay-by on the south-east side of Hill Rise, fronting Nos. 20-24 The Parade, and in the existing limited waiting areas in the service road fronting Nos. 1-19 The Parade.

2. Waiting will be prohibited between the hours of 8 a.m. 6 p.m. Monday to Saturday inclusive—

(a) on the north-west side of Hill Rise, between Sundon Park Road and Colebrook Avenue;

(b) in Colebrook Avenue, between Hill Rise and the rear access road serving Nos. 1-19 The Parade; and

(c) in the bellmouth junction of Hill Rise with the service road fronting Nos. 25 to 31 The Parade.

The Order will come into operation on the 14th March 1978. It contains exemptions in the standard form, permitting waiting for the purpose of boarding or alighting and loading or unloading goods and, where necessary, in connection with building operations, road and sewer works, public utilities street works, mail delivery and collection. Disabled persons' vehicles bearing the prescribed disabled person's badge and parking disc are permitted to wait for a period not exceeding two hours.

A copy of the Order and a plan showing its effect may be inspected during normal office hours at my office at the Town Hall, Luton.
