### PRIVY COUNCIL OFFICE

#### UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT 1923

A Statute made by the Governing Body of Christ Church College, in the University of Oxford, on the 22nd March 1978, has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas by Order in Council (63 NPP) of the 30th day of March 1977 new awards in respect of attributable death were introduced for widows and dependants of Hong Kong naval locally engaged ratings expressed in sterling for conversion into Hong Kong dollars, and increased rates for non-attributable death, expressed in Hong Kong dollars, were notified, and it is now expedient that the rates for attributable death should be increased with effect from the 16th day of November 1977 and continue to be expressed in sterling for conversion as aforesaid, and that the rates expressed in Hong Kong dollars for non-attributable death effective from the 1st day of January 1977 specified in the aforesaid Order in Council should be re-enacted without increase:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865 (c.73) and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions (Hong Kong Locally Engaged Ratings' Attributable and Non-attributable Death Awards) Order 1978.

2. The rates and conditions of award shall be as set out in the Schedule to this Order.

#### SCHEDULE

#### Conditions Governing the Award

A pension cannot be claimed as a right, and will not be granted or continued when the applicant is shown to be living with a man as his wife, nor will it be granted if the service of the rating has not been such as, in the opinion of the Defence Council, to justify the award.
