TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 211 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 to authorise the stopping up of the lengths of highway specified in the Schedule to this notice in the interests of the safety of the users of the main highway which is to be constructed in accordance with planning permission granted under Part III of that Act.

During 28 days from the 14th April 1978 copies of the draft Order and relevant plan may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Cardiff City Council, City Hall, Cardiff, and may be obtained, free of charge from the Welsh Office (Y Swyddfa Gymreig), Transport and Highways Group (quoting the reference WR15/71/16) at the address stated below.

Within the above-mentioned period of 28 days any person may, by notice to the Secretary of State, Welsh Office (Y Swyddfa Gymreig), Transport and Highways Group, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff, CF4 5PL (quoting the reference WR15/71/16), object to the making of the Order, stating the grounds of objection.

SCHEDULE

(All distances are approximate)

The lengths of highway to be stopped up are at Cardiff in the County of South Glamorgan and are those lengths of Radyr Court Road which extend from :

(i) its junction with Llantrisant Road to a point 29 yards north-east of the said junction ; and

(ii) a point 511 yards north-east of its junction with Llantrisant Road to a point 524 yards north-east of the said junction, a distance of 13 yards.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 212 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 for extinguishing any rights which persons may have to use vehicles on the lengths of highway specified in the Schedule to this notice.

The proposed Order will contain provisions for permitting the use of those lengths of highway by vehicles being used :

- (a) for police, ambulance or fire brigade purposes ;
- (a) for poince, and unarce of the origate purposes;
 (b) on behalf of a statutory undertaker or the Post Office and engaged upon the laying, erection, inspection, maintenance, alteration, repair, renewal or removal of any main, pipe, conduit, wire, cable or other apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878 under, in, on, over, along or across the lengths of highway or any land adjacent to the lengths of highway; or
- (c) in accordance with a special authorisation for that use given by or on behalf of the City Council of Cardiff, the County Council of South Glamorgan or the Chief Officer of Police for the South Wales Constabulary.

SCHEDULE

Description of lengths of highway to which this Order relates (the distances are approximate)

The lengths of highway are at Cardiff in the County of South Glamorgan and are those lengths of Radyr Court Road which extends from :

- (i) a point 29 yards north-east of its junction with Llantrisant Road to a point 120 yards north-east of the said junction, a distance of 91 yards;
- (ii) a point 221 yards north-east of its junction with Llantrisant Road to a point 423 yards north-east of the said junction, a distance of 202 yards;
