Notice is hereby given in pursuance of section 85 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act 1950 that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretary of State for Wales acting jointly, have made the following Order:

STATUTORY INSTRUMENTS 1978 No. 689 The Brucellosis (England and Wales) (Amendment No. 2) Order 1978

(Made 5th May 1978)

The Order which came into operation on 26th May amends the Brucellosis (England and Wales) Order 1977, as amended, in order to implement certain provisions of Council Directive 78/52/EEC of 13th December 1977 which relate to the accelerated eradication of brucellosis. The principal amendments made in implementation of these provisions are as follows:

(a) a prohibition is imposed on the treatment of bovine animals for brucellosis in an eradication or attested area;

animals for brucellosis in an eradication or aftested area;

(b) a veterinary inspector or other officer of the Ministry or an officer of the Secretary of State for Wales is given a power (in addition to his previous power in relation to bovine animals) to prohibit the movement of steers on to or off premises within an eradication or attested area except under the authority of a licence;

(c) provision is made for the retention and disposal or

(c) provision is made for the retention and disposal or destruction of the foetuses or calves and placentae from animals kept on premises within an eradication or attested area which are suspected of having aborted or

calved prematurely;
(d) provision is also made for the retention and subsequent disposal or destruction of placentae and dead calves (if any) from full-term calving from animals kept on premises within an eradication or attested area where infection is believed to exist;

(e) powers are given to require the disposal or destruc-

tion of straw, litter or other matter which has come into contact with animals suspected of having been in contact with brucellosis, and the treatment and storage of manure and slurry from places used by those animals;

(f) it is provided that milk from infected cows must be heat-treated before it may be fed to arimals on the same premises as those cows.

This Order also declares new areas of England and Wales to be eradication areas. The new areas are set out in that
