

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the above Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £100 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity. In addition, in accordance with the Clean Air Act, 1968, section 9 (1) any person who acquires or sells any solid fuel, other than an authorised fuel for use in a building in the smoke control area shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £100.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before 1st April 1979 or before a later date determined by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

Copies of the Order and the Map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the offices of the Directorate of Legal and Administrative Services, 4th Floor, Danum House, St. Sepulchre Gate, Doncaster at all reasonable hours during the period of 6 weeks from 15th June 1978.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary, Department of the Environment, Queen Anne's Chambers, Tothill Street, London, SW1H 9JY, subject to the confirmation of the Order.

SCHEDULE

All that area of Conisbrough and Denaby bounded:

To the east by a line starting at the Doncaster Road Bridge and proceeding North West along the Mineral Railway to the Conisbrough Viaduct and then North following the line of the River Don to Rainbow Bridge.

To the North the boundary runs west from Rainbow Bridge following the main railway line to its junction with the Metropolitan Borough boundary.

To the west by a line from the above junction in a southerly direction following the Metropolitan Borough boundary along the line of the River Don to Hooton Common.

To the south from the River Don eastwards along the Metropolitan Borough boundary to its junction with Old Road, Conisbrough, then along the centre line of Old Road and Church Street to its junction with West Street, then similarly down West Street and New Hill to Doncaster Road, then east along the centre of Doncaster Road to the Doncaster Road Bridge.

Conisbrough Smoke Control Order No. 10, 1978

Notice is hereby given that the Doncaster Borough Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act 1956 on 2nd June 1978 made an Order entitled the "Doncaster Borough Council (Conisbrough) Smoke Control Order No. 10, 1978" declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the above Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £100 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. To the north by a line from the junction of Old Road, Conisbrough and the Metropolitan Borough boundary running east along the centre of Old Road and Church Street to its junction with West Street, then similarly down West Street and New Hill to Doncaster Road, then east along the centre of Doncaster Road to the Doncaster Road Bridge then along the line of the Mineral Railway to its junction with the Edlington Ward boundary.

To the east from the above junction south along the ward boundary between Conisbrough Park and Edlington to its junction with the B.6094 then along the line of the road to the M.18.

To the south along the line of the M.18 to its junction with the Metropolitan Borough Boundary.

To the west northward from the M.18 following the Metropolitan Borough Boundary to its junction with Old Road, Conisbrough.
