Lisbon, October 4. N. S.

HE Chatham Man of War is arrived here in four Days from Gibraltar, and brings an Account, that the City of Cordova in Andalusa had declared for his Catholick Majesty. The Captain adds, that being in Company with the Grafton, and another British Man of War, they took in the Height of Cales two Genoele · Ships richly laden, having, besides other valuable Goods, four hundred thouland Pieces of Eight on Board, all belonging to feveral French Merchants; and that the Grafton had carried the Prizes into Port Mahon. The Portugueze Army hath paffed the Guadiana, and is penetrating into Andalusa, in order to oblige that Province to declare for King

Vienna, October 8. N. S. This Court having reseived Intimations of a Treaty on Foot between the Pope and the Princes of Italy, his Imperial Majely has ordered the Marquis de Prié, his Minister at the Court of Rome, to enquire diligently what Foundations there are for fuch a Report. General Heister having been lately indispo-fed, has left the Command of the Army in Hungary to General Culani, and is gone to a Seat he hath in Stirin. The Emperor is frequently in Conterence with his Ministers upon the Publick Affairs, especially those in Spain; and it is confirmed, that his Imperial Majerty has ordered a Reinforcement of fix thousand Men to be fint immediately to King Charles the Third. Our Advices from Constantinople tell us, General Ribinski, the King of Poland's Ambailador to the Ottoman Port, was speedily expected there; that it was not doubted but that he would meet with a very favourable Reception, and that his Negotiations would have the defired Success. It is said, the late Vizier having affected too much Popularity during his Administration, the Populace from much diffinited at his Diffgrace, and endeavoured to excite the Janisaries to a Revolt. We hear from Poland, that the Garrison of Caminiec has lately received a Reinforcement, and confilts at present of three thousand Men, plentifully supplied with Ammunition and Provisions: This is owing to the Care of Count Fleming, General of the Artillery, who has likewife ordered five thou-find Polith Horfe to be quartered near that Place, and the Fortress of St. Trinity.

Snished, and we have carried on several Saps from our Lodgments on the other fide, which are advanced within a few Paces of the Palifadoes, and we have already made very practicable Breaches at both Attacks. The Mareschal d'Harcourt having marched all his Troops over the Canche, has fent part of the Houshold away to their Winter Quarters, can-toned the Horse in the Country between the Canche and the Autie, and encamped the Foot in one Line from Hedin to Montreuil, having his Head Quarters at St. André au Bois.

Brussels, October 22. N. S. We understand by our Letters of the 18th from Paris, that a Courier from Spain had brought Advice, that the Dukes of Anjou and Vendome were gone from Valladolid towards Salaminea, where the Army is to affemble, and be joined by the Troops expected from the Frontiers of Portugal, under the Command of the Marquis de Bay. Count Staremberg broke up on the 24th from the Neighbourhood of Madrid, and is marched towards Andalusa, in order to join the Troops that are moving likewife from Portugal, after which he will advance towards the Enemy. These Letters add, that the Cities of Toledo and Segovia had submitted to his Catheliah Mainley has been proposed to the catheli his Catholick Majesty, who has ordered a Declaration to be Published at Madrid, Toledo, and other Places, wherein he commands all the Grandees that have followed the Duke of Anjou, and are still in his Interests, to quit that Prince, threatning otherwise to Conficate their Estates. All the Spanish Prisoners of State that are at prefent at Bayonne, are to be removed from thence to the Castle of Vincennes near Paris. The French King has ordered all his Intendants in the Maritime Provinces to declare, that the English and Dutch Fishermen are not to be Molested in any manner whatfoever, either by the Men of War, Privateers, or any other Ships belonging to France. Letters from Francfort of the 15th Infant advile, that the two Armies continued in their former Posts; that the Repartition of Winter Quarters for the Germans was agreed upon, but that there was no likelihood of their feparating 'till the Campaign in Flanders was brought to a Concluron. The Prince of Niewbourg, great Master of the Teutonick Order, arrived at Franciort the 13th, and will fet out from thence to Mayence as foon as he has Surveyed a new Palace he had ordered to be built in that City.

Higue, Oftober 21. N. S. According to our Advices from the Frontiers, the French have already begun to make their Forces file of towards their Winter Quarters, those of the Housfold being up-on their March to Paris. Monfieur Sommelfdyck arrived in the Texel the 19th with the Dutch Squadron from the Mediterranean. The States had fent two Expresses with Orders to that Admiral to continue there, but he had the Misfortune to miss them both.
