Rome, October 4. N. S.

N Wednesday last the Affair relating to the Worship of Confucius in China, was brought to a final Determination, and the Jesuits who have hitherto pretended that the Decrees sent from Rome, and published by Cardinal Tournon in China, against some Innovations introduced by them in celebrating the Mass, were only Temporal and Princeton of the Mass of visional, are commanded under severe Penalties to forbear raising any more Questions on that Subject for the future, and to obe, the fore-mentioned Decrees as absolute and definitive. Cardinal Grimani's Death hath made a fourteenth Vacancy in the Sacred College.

Copenhagen, October 18. N. S. Though we had some Expectations that the two Fleets would come to another Engagement, we are now affured they were not within two Leagues of each other. The Danes returned to their former States other. Inc Danes returned to their former Station, and the Swedes Iye at present before Ensled, where they have lately received a Reinforcement. The Camp is at length formed near this Place, and his Danish Majesty has ordered Tents to be provided for himself and all the Court. A Dutch Convoy came last Week from Holland into the Sound, and line ready to return

Holland into the Sound, and lies ready to return home with the first fair Wind.

From the Camp before Aire, October 23. N. S. At the Attack on the fide of Lambré we have pushed one of our Saps into the Place of Arms of the Saliant Angle before the Ravelin; our other five Saps are advanced along the Counterscarp, within a few Paces of the Pallisadoes. We have likewise finished two new Batteries, one of four, and the other of three Pieces of Cannon, to flank the Covered-way, and ruin the Enemy's Communications; the latter began to Fire this Morning, as the other will to Morning. other will to Morrow. On the fide of St. Quentin our Attack has been retarded by the great Rains, which still continue; however we have finished our five Bridges over the first Ditch between the Angle of the Bastion of Arras, and that of the Ravelin which covers the Port of Arras. The Sluces which the Enemy broke at St. Venant, during the Siege of that Place, being repaired, and the Passage Siege of that Place, being repaired, and the Paffage of the Lys cleared, the Boats with Ammunition and Provisions do now come up to the Camp, and we are fending away the heaviest of our Field

Pieces to be put on Board; the Roads in this Country being, after a Rainy Season, impracticable for Carriage of so great a Weight.

Brussels, Olober 25. N. S. Letters from Valladolid dated the 11th Instant tell us, that the Dukes of Anion and Vendome had joined the Dukes of Anjon and Vendome had joined the Army at Tordifillas on the Duero, where they expected the Detachment from Portugal, which, as the Enemy give out, confifts of nine thousand. Men. His Catholick Majesty advanced with his Forces on the 30th pair towards Talavera de la Reyna on the River Tago, where he was to be joined by a Body of eight thousand English and Portuguese, who had already passed the Guadiana in their March towards him. Our Advices from Paris say, the Mareschal de Noailles, who was sent from Spain to give the King a just Information of the Condition of Affairs in that Country, was to fet out from thence in a Day or two towards Rouslillion, where he proposeth to form a considerable Army, and make a Diversion; but the Season being so far advanced, there is no likelihood of much Action on that side. A Convoy consisting of two hundred Ships, laden with Forage and Ammunition, was to fail this Morning from Ghent up the Lys towards the Frontier.

Hague, October 24. N. S. Our Letters from Flanders tell us, that the Enemy having surprized a Post upon the Scarpe near St. Amand, called Hanon, in which we had a Garrison of fifty Men, a Detachment is fent from Tournay in order to distodge the French that are posted in it, and recover the Place. A Party of the Garrison of Ipres have fet Fire to a Magazine of Hay in Bruges, and entirely consumed it. The States have ordered the feveral Admiralties to fit out with all Expedition the Squadron that is to be fent into the Mediterranean under the Command of Vice-Admiral Pleterson, in the room of that lately brought home by Monteur de Sommelfdyck. That Admiral reports, that he parted from Sir John Norris on the 22d of September at Tarragona, where he was to leave four British Men of War to convoy the Troops designed for Valencia, and was preparing to Sail with the rest of the Fleet under his Command for Port Mahon. Signior Grimani, the Venetian Amballador, fet out from hence yesterday to the Erill, where the Rotterdam Convoy is ready to Sail with the first fair Wind for England.

Falmonia.

Falmouth, October 14. On the 12th, at Night, failed the Orange Galley Man of War of Zealand, having under her Convoy the Page Frigat of and for London from Virginia, Captain Cook Commander, with a Prize from Martineco, and four Dutch Doggers from Ireland. This Day arrived the Transitory of and for this Place from the Canaries in nineteen Days, Michael Terpen Mafter.

Plimouth, October 15. Yesterday came in a Dutch Man of War from Falmouth, with the Page Frigat from Virginia, four Dutch Doggers from Ireland, and a Prize, all five for Zealand. At the fame time the Cornwall, Litchfeld and Pembroke failed to the Westward. The Plimouth is come in from the Eastward, with the Francis Galley for the Maderas, and Fair Alliance for Offend. Day failed the Medway with five or fix Vessels for Falmouth, and the Carter Frigat and Vulcan Bri-

gantine for Ireland.

Tarmouth, October 16. On the 14th failed out of our Road a Fleet of Merchant Ships laden with Corn and Herrings for Holland, under Convoy of her Majeily's Ships the Folkstone and Ad-vice's Prize; but the Wind coming contrary, they returned again Yesterday into the Road. same time came in with them her Majesty's Ships the Advice and Nightingale, with a Fleet under their Convoy, from Holland, who passed for the Humber. There came also into our Road on the 14th divers laden Colliers from Newcastle, who came thence in Company of several others, from whom they separated in bad Weather on the North Coast.
