An Envove lat.ly ar ived from the Coffacks in Ukra nia, has had t is Audience from their Majefties, giving them great affarances of their allegiance and fidelity to the Crown and the concernment they had for the rupture of the late generil Diet, confi ming the news of the Fartais late rivation of Ukrania, with an Army of 40 thouland men ; adding, that about 15 thousand Collacks attenuing their motion, fell foluckily upon them, as they were divided, taking the spoil of the Countrey, that they wholly rought and defeated them, Ki ling many, chocing the reft, and taking many prifoners.

The Palatine of Cracodia, Morffein the Great Tresfurer of Poland and a creature of the late Queen; the Pri es Michael Radzivil, one of the Lubsinirsky and others, have had leveral private conferences ace Dantzig, where is allo arrived the French Minister the Sidur Akaky Trunchions, Staves, or Cones, upon pain of Corpofrom Koningsberg; the Mugistrates of that City apprehending some dangets are more then usually careful of p event many dilorders, and their Masters are declared the defence of their City. The Archbishop of Guefne to be responsible for any thing that shall be done by was also expected there, but tis fince faid, that he is rather inclined to defert their party and close with his Majefty.

Dantzig, June 4. On Friday morhing arrived here the Vice-Chancelfor of Poland, fent by His Majefty to tak the Homage of this place, and to oblerve the motion of those Perfons, who, out of a diffarisfaction to His M jeffy and Government, have had feveral Conferences together, but begin now to break up their Meeting, and dilpole of themfelves to other places. 'Tis feid His Majefty has now refolved to call an Affembly of the Nobility in the

open Field. 'Tis as confidently reported that Marshal Sobiefky, and the Arch-bifhop of Guefnes have reconcil'd themielves to the King, who has fummon'd in thole Polith Lords, who have retir'd themtelves to this City, Pruffia, and other places, to repair immediately to Warfam, upon pain of Confilcation of their Effates.

Paris, June TI. On Friday last the King arriving at Beauvois, the Dauphin was attended by a Guard of 200 little Ladds about his own age, Sons to perfons of the greateft Quality of the Country thereabours, all of them habited alike in White Taffata, with their Armes proportionable to their Age, with which they mounted and relieved the Guard, lodging all the night upon Carpets, and attending him in that posture during his stay there.

On Sunday last His Maj sty went to take a view of his Buildings at Verfailles.

A Courrier lately arrived from Madrid brings Letters from thence bearing date the 28th part, informing that the young King of Spain had been dangeronfly ill of an Ague, which was now much leffened, and

fit was not at all violent and of thort continuance.

From Roufillon we ate informed, thất the Count de Chamilly having intelligence that the Miquelets or Mountaineers were again gottogether in a little Village called la Manere, neer the Pyrenean hills 5 the prefently ordered his forces to march towards them, which they did the 28th of the laft month, to engage them and beat them thence, but the Miquelets durit not endure a Charge, but filing at a diffance, and killing fome few of his peopler redired firthet into the Mountains, where they had fo well guarded the narrow pailes, that he could not purfue then whereupon the Count immediately employ'd to them the Confuls or chief Magiltrates of the Town to let them know that unless they laid down their Arms and returned home he should be obliged to fire their houses and destroy their Inditationi, The Confuls not returning according to their promife, nor returning him any answer the Count ordered the firing full of the Confuls houles, and intende to burn all the reft of them, having first spent some time thereabouts to reduce these tobbers, if possible, to better obedichće.

From Languedoe we are tolds hat the Marquis de Caffres, his Majeftics Lieutenant in that Province, with feveral Gentlemen of the faid Province, had hazarded their perfons amongst the Country people of Vivaretz, who had lately taken Arms, and had fo far wrought upon them by his good language, that he perfwaded them to lay down their Arms, he first promifing them, that no farther inquiry input be made ano. git them for their penifhments and that the new I upoft the uld be taken off : bace which the people a e di peried and returned to their houles, and its beli ved will be perfwaded, to live peaceably, fo that there app. ars now no. cceffity of lerling a Garifon among ft. them to oblige them to it

rat pu i iment and impris ament, which tis hoped will them against the Civil interest.
