

from thence to the Army. The French have forbidden the Peasants in Artois to Sow any Corn this Year, to the end the Allies may be unable to subsist their Troops in that Country, and be thereby deterred from laying Siege to Arras the ensuing Campaign. The Enemy having formed a Design of setting Fire to all the Magazines of Hay in the Frontier Garrisons belonging to the Allies, on purpose to hinder them from taking the Field so early as they did the last Summer; and having accordingly endeavoured to Fire the Magazine at Lisle, but without Success; great Care is taken to prevent such Attempts for the future, and a strict Enquiry is made after the Incendiaries. The Commissioners of the several Admiralties having received the Orders of the States for that purpose, are forwarding the Squadron designed for the Mediterranean with the greatest Application. That Squadron is to consist of fourteen Ships, and we are assured it will be ready to sail before the end of the next Month. The States of Holland having received upon a Loan of two Millions at four per Cent. Interest, and two Millions more for which they are to pay nine per Cent. in Annuities, are separated for a Fortnight, by which time the State of the War for the ensuing Year will be ready to be laid before them. The Report of the French having possessed themselves of the Post of Hanon near St. Amand proves false, and was grounded upon the appearance of the Chevalier de Luxembourg in that Neighbourhood. Cardinal de Bouillon is newly chosen Abbot of St. Amand.
