To whom it may concern.

Pursuant to section 275 (5) of the Customs and Excise Act 1952, and paragraph 1 of the 7th Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the customs and excise Acts and enactments amending those Acts, certain goods, namely a Commer 4 Ton Lorry, blue and yellow coloured bearing Registration mark SYF 622F, have been seized in Fellows Road, N.W.3, as liable to forfeiture upon the grounds that the said lorry was used for the carriage of rebated heavy oil in its fuel tank, the

for the carriage of rebated heavy oil in its fuel tank, the heavy oil itself being liable to forfeiture.

Whereby and by force of section 277 of the Customs and Excise Act 1952 and section 11 (4) (a) of the Hydrocarbon Oil (Customs and Excise) Act 1971 the said goods are liable to forfeiture.
