The M.25 Motorway (Yeoveney to Poyle Section Side Roads) Order 197

The Airport Spur Trunk Road (M.25 Poyle Interchange to Heathrow) Order 197

The Airport Spur Trunk Road (M.25 Poyle Interchange to Heathrow Side Roads) Order 197

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make the following Orders:

1. An Order under section 13 of the Highways Act 1959, in relation to that part of the M.25 Motorway which will be situated between Yeoveney and Poyle in the County of Surrey—

- (a) authorising him—
 - (i) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways;
 - (ii) to stop up highways;
 - (iii) to construct new highways;
 - (iv) to stop up private means of access to premises; and
 - (v) to provide new means of access to premises; all on or in the vicinity of the proposed route of the above-mentioned part of the said Motorway; and

(b) providing for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the County Council of Surrey as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new highway has been completed and is open for through traffic.

2. An Order under section 7 of the Highways Act 1959, providing that a road about 2.04 kilometres (1.25 miles) in length (including two roundabouts) which he proposes to construct from the proposed M.25 Poyle Interchange to Heathrow Airport in the county of Surrey shall become a trunk road as from the date when the Order comes into operation.

3. An Order under section 9 of the Highways Act 1959, in relation to the aforementioned new Airport Spur Trunk Road in the said County—

- (a) authorising him—
 - (i) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways;
 - (ii) to stop up highways;
 - (iii) to construct new highways; and
 - (iv) to provide new means of access to premises; all on or in the vicinity of the proposed route of the above-mentioned new Trunk Road; and

(b) providing for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the County Council of Surrey as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new highway has been completed and is open for through traffic.

Copies of the draft Orders and of the relevant plans may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours from 22nd August 1978 to 9th October 1978 at the Department of Transport, Room S7/09, 2 Marsham Street, London S.W.1 and the South Eastern Road Construction Unit, Room 110, Federated House, London Road, Dorking, Surrey; at the offices of the Surrey County Council, County Deeds Office, Room 119, County Hall Kingston upon Thames, Surrey and the Spelthorne Borough Council, Knowle Green, Staines, Middlesex; at the Staines Public Library, Clarence Street, Staines, Middlesex; Egham Public Library, High Street, Egham, Surrey and Stanwell Moor Post Office, Horton Road, Stanwell Moor, Staines, Middlesex.

Any person may not later than 9th October 1978, object to the making of the Orders by notice to the Secretary of State, at his address at the South Eastern Road Construction Unit, quoting the title of the Order and stating the grounds of objection. In the preparation of an objection and the statement of grounds of objection it should be borne in mind that the substance of any objection or representation may be communicated to other people who may be affected by it.

The three Orders to which this notice relates replace earlier Orders, bearing the same titles and now withdrawn, for which notice of the Secretary of State's proposal to make was first published on 6th December.

STAMP DUTIES

Whereas section 12(2) of the Finance Act 1899 provides that Her Majesty's Commissioners of Inland Revenue may substitute, as respects any foreign or colonial currency mentioned in the Schedule to that Act, any rate of exchange for that specified in the Schedule and may add to the Schedule the rate of exchange for any foreign or colonial currency not mentioned therein, and that such Act shall be construed as if any rate of exchange for the time being substituted or added were contained in the said Schedule, and in the case of the substitution of the rate of exchange as if the rate for which the new rate is substituted were omitted from that Schedule; and whereas by notices duly advertised pursuant to the said Section the said Commissioners have from time to time, and lastly by notice duly advertised in the month of December 1977, substituted certain rates of exchange for those contained in the Schedule, and have added thereto certain rates of exchange. Now, therefore, the said Commissioners do hereby give notice that they substitute the following rates of exchange, based mainly on market rates which have been rounded, for those contained in the Schedule to the Finance Act 1899, as varied by the above-mentioned notices:
