MEDICINES ACT, 1968

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 209 of the above Act entitled "The Stopping up of Highways (County of West Midlands) (No. 18) Order 1978" authorising the stopping up of a part of New Cross Street, Tipton, and requiring the provision of a new highway.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971
