Notice is hereby given that the Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act on 4th August 1978 made an Order entitled the Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council (Mapplewell) Smoke Control Order No. 22 1978 declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation. Subject to the exemptions provided by virtue of subsection (4) of section 11 of the Act, if on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £100 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before 1st November 1979 or before a later date determined by the Secretary of State for the Environment. Copies of the Order and the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Town Hall, Barnsley at all reasonable times during the period of 6 weeks from 8th September 1978.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary of State, Department of the Environment, Whitehall, London, S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.
