ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1967, SECTION 12 (1)

The Trunk Road (London Road, Bicester) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 1978

Notice is hereby given that he Secretary of State for Transport proposes to make an Order on the London-Birmingham Trunk Road (A.41).

The Order, which is being made to enable works to be carried out, will be in operation, when the appropriate signs are erected, from 8 a.m. on Sunday 1st October 1978 until such time as the works have been completed.

The effect of the Order will be to prohibit traffic travelling on that length of the trunk road which extends from a point 248 metres south-east of its junction with Launton Road to a point 273 metres south-east of the same junction (Railway Level Crossing across the Bletchley-Oxford Railway Line at Bicester Level Crossing).

Traffic will be diverted as follows:

Traffic approaching from the south-east will be diverted right on to the Blackthorn-Launton-Caversfield Road (Class III) and then south on the Buckingham-Bicester Road (A.421) to the A.41.

Traffic approaching from the north will use the same route in reverse, or the Bicester-Launton-Blackthorn Road (Class III).

It is envisaged that the works will be completed by 4 p.m. on Sunday 1st October 1978.

## HIGHWAYS ACTS 1959 TO 1971

The Levens Bridge-Greenodd-Barrow-in-Furness Trunk Roads (A.590 Greenodd Diversion Side Roads) (No. 2) Order 197.

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes, in relation to the diversion of the Trunk Road at Greenodd in the County of Cumbria to make under section 9 of the Highways Act 1959 an Order which will:

- (a) authorise him-
