- 12. That cycleway between Felmongers (Mark Hall South) and First Avenue at Mark Hall School.
- 13. That cycleway betwen Rectory Lane, Sumners and Katherines via Katherines Way.
- 14. That cycleway between Netteswell Road and Edinburgh Way.
- 15. That cycleway between Church Road and Commonside Road.
