PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas the Secretary of State for the Environment after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of St. Giles, Lockton, in the County of North Yorkshire, ten days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that burials should be discontinued forthwith and entirely in St. Giles Churchyard, in the said

Parish, shown hatched and heavily outlined in black on the plan annexed hereto:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 11th December next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the *London Gazette*, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 11th December.
