Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Secretary of State for the Environment that burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in St. Pinnock Parish Old Churchyard, St. Pinnock, in the county of Cornwall, has in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 25th day of July 1978, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council: Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853 (1853, c. 134) and of all other powers Her enabling is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to

order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:

1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in St. Pinnock Parish Old Chutchyard, St. Pinnock, in the county of Cornwall, which is shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (St. Pinnock Parish Old Churchyard, St. Pinnock, Cornwall) Order 1978.
