

## HEREFORD AND WORCESTER COUNTY COUNCIL

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967  
*The County of Hereford and Worcester*  
 (A44, Waterside, Evesham)  
 (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that on 29th December 1979, the County Council of Hereford and Worcester made an Order under Section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, and of all other enabling powers, the effect of which will be to extend the existing prohibition of waiting by vehicles between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. (Mondays to Saturdays inclusive) on the west side of A44, Waterside, Evesham from a point 15 metres (49 feet) south-west of the junction with Coopers Lane for a distance of 50 metres (164 feet) in a south-westerly direction.

Exemptions in the Order will permit waiting for the purposes of:

1. Picking up and setting down passengers.
2. Loading and unloading goods.
3. Delivering and collecting mail by the Post Office.
4. Any building or demolition operation, the removal of any obstruction of traffic, the improvement or maintenance of the roads and the supply of gas, electricity, water and telephone services.
5. Disabled persons' vehicles displaying a badge issued under the Local Authority's Orange Badge Scheme.
6. Fire Brigade, Ambulance and Police services.

The Order will come into operation on 8th January 1979.

A copy of the Order as made and a copy of the relevant map can be inspected at the County Hall, Spetchley Road, Worcester between the hours of 9.30 a.m.—12.30 p.m. and 2 p.m.—4 p.m. from Monday to Friday inclusive.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in the Order on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant Section or of Section 84A, 84B or 84C of the Act or of any regulations made under the said Section 84C has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made (such date stated in this Notice), make application for the purpose to the High Court.—Dated 8th January 1979.

## THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF WEST SUSSEX

(Ardingly: West Hill Road (Part))  
 (Prohibition of Waiting and Prohibition of Loading and Unloading) Order, 1979

Notice is hereby given that the West Sussex County Council on the 3rd January, 1979, made an Order under the provisions of Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act, 1972, and by Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act, 1974, the effect of which will be to prohibit vehicles from waiting at any time on both sides of West Hill Road, Ardingly, from a point 436 metres south-east of its junction with Paddockhurst Road to a point 532 metres west of Church Lane, a distance of 620 metres.

Exceptions are provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait in the length of road:—

- (i) if being used in connection with any building operation or demolition or the repair of the road or the services therein;
- (ii) if being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (iii) if being used for police, ambulance or fire brigade purposes;
- (iv) if being used for the removal of an obstruction to traffic; or
- (v) if being used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act, 1953.

A copy of the Order which will come into operation on the 10th January, 1979, and a plan showing the affected

length of road, may be inspected at the County Hall, Chichester, during normal office hours.

Any person who wishes to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended as aforesaid, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks from the 3rd January, 1979, apply to the High Court for this purpose.—Dated 4th January, 1979.

## WEST SUSSEX COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County Council of West Sussex*  
 (Shoreham-by-Sea: Various Roads, Shoreham Beach)  
 (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Prohibition of Cycling) Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that the West Sussex County Council on 3rd January 1979, made an Order under the provisions of Sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and by Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which is:

1. To prohibit vehicles from waiting at any time in lengths of the following roads in Shoreham Beach, Shoreham-by-Sea:

Forthaven, Harbour Way, Kingston Bay Road, Lower Beach Road, Old Fort Road, Roundabouts at junctions with Shingle Road and The Burrells, Old Fort Road (cul-de-sac);

2. To prohibit vehicles from waiting between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. in lengths of the following roads in Shoreham Beach, Shoreham-by-Sea:

East Meadway, Forthaven, Lower Beach Road and The Meadway;

3. To prohibit vehicles from waiting between 1st April to 30th September between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. in lengths of the following roads in Shoreham Beach, Shoreham-by-Sea:

Beach Road, Flag Square, Hardy Close, Kingston Bay Road, Kings Crescent, Kings Gap, Old Fort Road, Old Ford Road (cul-de-sac) and Weald Dyke;

4. To prohibit vehicles from waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., Mondays to Fridays inclusive, in lengths of Harbour Way, Shoreham Beach, Shoreham-by-Sea.

5. To limit waiting to one hour return prohibited within one hour between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Mondays to Fridays in lengths of Harbour Way, Shoreham Beach, Shoreham-by-Sea.

6. To prohibit cycling on the following lengths of footpaths in Shoreham-by-Sea:

- (a) Feversham Close to Winterton Way;
- (b) Feversham Close to Fowey Close;
- (c) Harbour Way to Falcon Close; and
- (d) Shingle Road to the eastern end of Cheal Close.

Exceptions are contained in the Order to enable vehicles (i) to stop and pick up and set down passengers, goods or merchandise, (ii) to wait when engaged in building operations or the repair of the road or the services therein, (iii) to take in petrol, oil, air or water from a garage, and (iv) to wait in connection with weddings and funerals.

Invalid carriages and disabled persons' vehicles displaying in the relevant position a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority under the provisions of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975, and a parking disc will be permitted to wait in the lengths of road in 1, 2, 3 and 4 above for periods of up to two hours their return being prohibited within one hour and for an unlimited period in the length of road in 5 above.

A copy of the Order which will come into operation on 10th January 1979, together with a plan showing the affected lengths of road may be inspected at the County Hall, Chichester, during normal office hours.
