Order 1978*

Notice is hereby given that on 3rd January 1979 pursuant to arrangements made under Section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the County Council of Tyne and Wear, the Borough Council of Gateshead made an Order under Section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

This Order which makes it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in that length of Back Durham Place, Low Fell, specified in the Schedule below, comes into effect on 12th January 1979.

Exceptions are provided in the Order for vehicles to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight, to enable goods to be loaded or unloaded, to enable a vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or services herein, to enable a vehicle to be used in pursuance of statutory powers and duties, and, for a period of not more than two hours, users of cars displaying the disabled person's badge and parking disc.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the length of the restricted road may be examined at the office of the undersigned on Monday to Thursday between 8.45 a.m. and 5 p.m. and Friday 8.45 a.m. and 4.35 p.m.
