

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to extinguish the footpath running from the south-west corner of field O.S. 7268 and proceeding in a generally easterly direction over field numbers O.S. 7268, 0065 and 0058, for a distance of approximately 650 metres, the new path to commence at point A on the map which is situated at the south-western corner of O.S. Field 7268 and proceeding northwards along Bradley Lane for 210 metres turning easterly for 260 metres along Bradley Lane then turning south-easterly along the south-western boundary of field O.S. 0081 for 160 metres and entering field O.S. 0058 where it follows the northern boundary for 175 metres turning southwards on the western side of Bradleys Drain for a distance of 55 metres to the footbridge at point B on the map.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and of the map contained in it has been deposited at the Divisional Highway Offices, Canal Road, Selby, and may be inspected free of charge during office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from 11th January 1979, but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 of the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act within 6 weeks from 11th January 1979, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.

The North Yorkshire County Council Stopping Up of Bridleway No. 17 at Kexby Subject to Reservation of Footpath.

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the County of North Yorkshire, the highway authority, intends to apply to the Magistrates' Court sitting at Selby on Friday, 23rd February 1979, at the Court House, New Lane, Selby at 10 a.m. for an Order that the Bridleway known as Bridleway Number 17 at Kexby on the Definitive Map of Public Rights of Way maintained by the County Council commencing at the Stamford Bridge Parish Boundary at the railway bridge and leading along the west bank of the River Derwent to the York-Hull road at the old Kexby Bridge for a distance of 3 miles or thereabouts be authorised to be stopped up on the grounds that it is unnecessary subject to the reservation of a right of way on foot only.

The North Yorkshire County Council Footpath No. 15 (Part) High Birstwith Diversion Order 1978

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on 18th December 1978, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Department of the Environment for confirmation as an opposed Order or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the North Yorkshire County Council.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to divert the public footpath commencing at point A (marked on the map) on Crow Hill Lane and runs in a north-westerly direction for 12 metres and then westerly for 88 metres to point B then turns north-westerly across O.S. Field Nos. 6300 and 5016 for approximately 336 metres to point C before turning westerly into O.S.

Field No. 3700 for 28 metres to point D, the new path commences at point E on Crow Hill Lane and runs north-westerly across O.S. Fields Nos. 5990, 5000 and 3700 to point D a distance of approximately 410 metres.

A copy of the Order and map contained in it has been deposited at the Highways Divisional Office, Starbeck, Harrogate and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

If you wish to have sent to you in due course a notice to the effect that the Order has been confirmed, and a copy of the Order as confirmed, you should write to the Chief Executive, North Yorkshire County Council, County Hall, Northallerton, giving your name and address to which the documents may be sent.

Any representations or objections with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Chief Executive at the above address before 8th February 1978 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the North Yorkshire County Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is sent to the Secretary of State any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be submitted with the Order.

The North Yorkshire County Council Bridleway No. 14 (Part) Kirby Grindalythe Diversion Order 1978

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on 18th December 1978, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Department of the Environment for confirmation as an opposed Order or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the North Yorkshire County Council.
