THURROCK BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Thurrock (Footpath between Harty Close and Long Lane, Grays) (Prohibition of Cycling) Order 1979.

Notice is hereby given that on 3rd January 1979, the Thurrock Borough Council, pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the Essex County Council, in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, made the above-named Order.

This Order, which prohibits the riding of pedal bicycles or tricycles on the length of footpath which extends from its junction with Harty Close to its junction with Long Lane, Grays in the Borough of Thurrock, will come into operation on 15th January 1979.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the restricted length of footpath to which the Order relates are available for public inspection during normal office hours at the address given below.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from 3rd January 1979, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

WELWYN HATFIELD DISTRICT COUNCIL

The District of Welwyn Hatfield (Various Roads, Cuffley) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that the Welwyn Hatfield District Council pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the County Council of Hertford have made an Order under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, the effect of which will be to limit parking to a period not exceeding 20 minutes between the hours of 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. (return prohibited within those hours) on any day other than Saturday and Sunday in the lengths of road following:

1. *Lambs Close*, on both sides, from a point 19.8 metres (85 feet) from its junction with Station Road in a southerly direction for a distance of 63 metres.
2. *Maynards Place (Lay-by)*.—The lay-by on the western side of Maynards Place from a point 9.2 metres (30 feet) from its junction with Station Road in a northerly direction for a distance of 30.48 metres (100 feet).
3. *Station Road (Service Road)*, on both sides of the service road fronting the flats No. 31-55 Station Road.
4. *Tolmers Road*, from a point 39.63 metres (130 feet) from its junction with Station Road in a northerly direction for a distance of 85 metres on both sides.
5. *Tolmers Gardens*, from its junction with Tolmers Road in a westerly direction for a distance of 22 metres on both sides.
6. *The Mead Way*, from a point 42.67 metres (140 feet) from its junction with Station Road in a northerly direction for a distance of 75 metres on both sides.

Exemptions will be provided in the Order for the purposes of boarding, alighting, loading and unloading, building and road works, the maintenance of essential services, funerals and the delivery or collection of postal packets by vehicles in the service of the Post Office, and disabled persons' vehicles displaying the relevant disabled person's badge.

The Order will come into operation on 19th January 1979. A copy of the Order and a plan showing the lengths of road affected may be inspected during normal office hours at the Council Offices, The Campus, Welwyn Garden City (Room 226), the offices of The Housing Manager, 16 St. Albans Road East, Hatfield and at The Library, Cuffley Hall, Station Road, Cuffley.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 19 of the Local Government Act 1972 or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or of any instrument made under it have not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made make application for the purpose to the High Court.

SOUTH YORKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The South Yorkshire County Council (Access Road off Hall Close Avenue, Whiston) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1979.

Notice is hereby given that on 8th January 1979 the South Yorkshire County Council made an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of the Order which will come into operation on 24th January 1979 will be to prohibit waiting by vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Monday to Friday (inclusive) in the sides of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Exceptions to the Order will permit waiting for the purpose of picking up and setting down passengers, loading and unloading goods, in connection with building, industrial or demolition operations, the removal of obstructions to traffic, the maintenance of the road and the services therein, in pursuance of statutory powers or duties and for the collection and delivery of postal packets. The usual exceptions for disabled persons' vehicles are also included in the Order.

A copy of the Order together with a map showing the restricted road may be examined during normal office hours at the offices of:

- (i) the County Council, County Hall, Barnsley; and
- (ii) Rotherham Borough Council, Civic Buildings, Frederick Street, Rotherham.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any of the provisions contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, amended as aforesaid, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in
