NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 210

The Leeds City Council (Footpath No. 175 (Part) Millshaw, Beeston, Leeds), Public Diversion Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 21st March 1979 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment and Transport for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Leeds City Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way running from a point at the south-easterly corner of the grounds of the Drysalers Public House, Ring Road, Churwell, for a distance of 180 metres approximately in a north-easterly direction to a point at the western side of the railway footbridge off Crow Nest Lane to a line running from and to the aforementioned starting and finishing points following a route adjacent and parallel to the existing footpath on the southerly side of Crow Nest Lane for a distance of 125 metres approximately before turning south-easterly and following the western boundary of the railway for a distance of 75 metres approximately.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the offices of the Director of Administration, Room 227, Civic Hall, Leeds 1, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. Mondays to Fridays.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Director of Administration (Ref. A5/PB/11/99/66) Civic Hall, Leeds 1, not later than 20th April 1979, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Leeds City Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment and Transport for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

A copy of the plan of the Conservation Area has been deposited at the offices of the District Secretary, West Norfolk District Council, Baxters Plain, Kings Lynn and the Central Area Manager, Town Hall, King's Lynn and may be inspected at any time during normal office hours.

The enlarged Conservation Area extends on the west along the quayside from Page Stair Lane on the north to the Millfleet on the south. It extends eastwards to include properties fronting on to:

Littleport Street including the Town Walls and Eastgate Bridge.
High Street.
Railway Road.
Portland Street.

The Walks eastwards to include the Red Mount.
West side of Church Street.
St. James Street.
Tower Street to include 2-16 Blackfriars Street.
