The London-Fishguard Trunk Road (A40) (Gloucester Road, Cheltenham) (Prohibition of Right Turns) Order 1979.

The Secretary of State for Transport has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 on the London-Fishguard Trunk Road (A40) in the Borough of Cheltenham in the County of Gloucestershire.

The effect of the Order, which comes into operation on 5th April 1979, is to prohibit westbound traffic from making a right hand turn into Church Road at its westernmost junction with the trunk road, known in part as Gloucester Road and in part as Lansdown Road, Cheltenham.

Any person who desires to question the validity of, or of any provision contained in, the Order, on the ground that it is not within the powers with respect to the Order conferred by the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of, or of any instrument made under, any provision of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of 28th March 1979, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

The London-Fishguard Trunk Road (A40) (Gloucester Road, Cheltenham) (Prescribed Route) Order 1979

The Secretary of State for Transport has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 on the London-Fishguard Trunk Road (A40) in the Borough of Cheltenham in the County of Gloucestershire.

The effect of the Order, which comes into operation on 5th April 1979, is to prohibit eastbound traffic in that length of the trunk road known as Gloucester Road, Cheltenham, which lies to the south of the triangular traffic island at the junction of Gloucester Road and Lansdown Road, from proceeding in any direction other than from Gloucester Road into Lansdown Road.

GENERAL LICENCE

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food by this general licence issued pursuant to the powers of paragraph 4 of the Heather and Grass Burning (England and Wales) Regulations 1949 authorises, subject to the conditions set out below and to the provisions of the Regulations, the burning of heather and grass between the first and tenth days of April 1979 in the area of the county of Derbyshire within the Peak Park Planning Area (county boundary of Derbyshire definitive area).

CONDITIONS ATTACHING TO THIS LICENCE

It is a condition of this licence that persons within the specified area who wish to burn between these specified dates shall notify the local fire authority and the police at least 48 hours before each occasion on which burning is due to begin.
