
The Plan referred to in the foregoing Order in Council



At the Court at Buckingham Palace the 30th day of March 1979 Present,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Secretary of State for the Environment that burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in St. Giles's Old Churchyard, Great Coxwell, in the County of Oxfordshire, which is shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto, has, in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 6th day of February 1979, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853 (1853 c.134.) and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

- 1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in St. Giles's Old Churchyard, Great Coxwell, in the County of Oxfordshire, shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto.
- This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (St. Giles's Old Churchyard, Great Coxwell, Oxfordshire) Order 1979.
