#### STATE SCHEME PREMIUMS-MARKET LEVEL INDICATORS

The new state pension scheme which started in April 1978, allows contracted out occupational pension schemes in cer-tain circumstances, to transfer the responsibility or part of the responsibility, for their members' guaranteed minimum pension rights to the state scheme by the payment of premiums.
