ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

The Trunk Road (40 m.p.h. Speed Limit) (No.) Order 1979

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under sections 74 (1) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of

which will be that no person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour on:

(a) that length of the East of Snaith-York-Thirsk Stockton-on-Tees-Sunderland Trunk Road (A19) at Barlby in the County of North Yorkshire which extends from its junction with the eastern limb of Olympia Crescent to a point 60 metres north of its junction with Turnhead Crescent (a distance measured along the said road of approximately 3,200 metres), which is at present subject to a 30 mile per hour speed limit imposed by an Order which it is proposed to revoke; and

(b) that length of the Liverpool-Leeds-Hull Trunk Road (A63) at Osgodby in the County of North Yorkshire which extends from its junction with the East of Snaith-York-Thirsk-Stockton-on-Tees-Sunderland Trunk Road (A19) to a point 305 metres south-east of its junction with Sand Lane (a distance measured along the said road of approximately 1,400 metres).

A copy of the proposed Order and a copy of the Order to be revoked together with a plan illustrating the proposal and a statement explaining the Secretary of State's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be inspected during office hours at the office of Mr. F. Variation of the Gamlingay Award

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by sections 25 (4) and 109 (6) of the Land Drainage Act 1976 has now confirmed the Anglian Water Authority (Variation of the Gamlingay Award) Order 1979 (S.I. 1979/511) made on 12th March 1979 confirming a Scheme submitted to him under section 25 (1) of the Gamlingay Award so far as they relate to a certain water-course lying in the Parish of Gamlingay in the District of South Cambridgeshire in the county of Cambridgeshire.

By paragraphs 10, 11 and 12 of Schedule 3 to the Land Drainage Act 1976, it is provided that if any person aggrieved by an Order desires to question its validity on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Act or that any requirement of the Act has not been complied with he may, within 6 weeks after the publication of this notice, make an application for the purpose to the High Court, and if any such application is duly made, the court, if satisfied that the Order is not within the powers of the Act or that the interests of the applicant have been substantially prejudiced by any requirements of the Act not having been complied with, may quash the Order either generally or in so far as it affects the applicant.
