TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under Section 212 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 for extinguishing any rights

which persons may have to use vehicles on the lengths of highway specified in Schedule 1 to this Notice.

The Order contains provisions for permitting the use of the lengths of highway referred to in Schedule 1 to this Notice by vehicles in the cases specified in Schedule 2 to this Notice.

Copies of the Order and relevant plan may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Torfaen Borough Council, Town Hall, Pontypool, and may be obtained, free of charge, on application to the Secretary of State, Welsh Office (Y Swyddfa Gymreig) Transport and Highways Group, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff CF4 SPL, quoting the reference WR15/35/11.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to

question the validity thereof or of any provision contained

therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within, six weeks of 21st May 1979 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or any provision contained therein.

Any person who, at the time of the coming into force of the Order, has an interest in land having lawful access to the highway to which the Order relates shall be entitled to be compensated by the Torfaen Borough Council as the local planning authority in respect of any depreciation in the value of his interest which is directly attributable to the Order and of any other loss or damage which is so attributable.
